A Message from Fr.

Greetings from the Holy Land! As I write, we are completing day five of our pilgrimage and touring. When 4pm Mass starts this weekend, we will be checking in at the airport to begin our journey across 8 time zones to get home. Last weekend I offered Mass "for the people" of St. Anthony Parish at Mount Carmel near the modern city of Haifa, where the Prophet Elijah resided in a cave-grotto during the reign of King Ahab. We famously remember in the 18th chapter of the first book of Kings that somewhere in that vicinity, Elijah

challenged 450 priests of Baal for the spiritual leadership of ancient Israel. In recent centuries, the Carmelite order was founded, with special devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary, to live religious life on that site where they maintain a church to this day.

One of the notable events of being in the Holy Land and celebrating Mass with the pilgrims is that many of the holy sites have their own proper Mass formularies which can be celebrated almost every day (except for the highest and most important feasts like Easter and Christmas). For example, on Mt. Tabor, a Mass celebrating the Transfiguration can be celebrated by visiting priests, with a unique set of prayers for that particular place. Similarly, we celebrated Mass on the Mount of the Beatitudes and at St Peter of Gallicantu ("gallus" = "rooster", "cantu" = "singing" or in this case, "crowing") and were able to read and preach and celebrate unique prayers that belong to those particular places. At the Church of the Nativity, it might sound like a child's dream, but it is true... they celebrate Christmas every day!

My point is that celebrating these events in or near the place they took place imprints a deep, even emotional encounter with the reality of our faith, which transcends space and time. Jesus is no more or no less present on the altar in Jerusalem or in Quincy, IL, but our human senses are especially invited to draw even nearer to the profound mysteries of faith we celebrate, knowing that some small element affirms that faith by scientific or archeologi-


cal discoveries in the place, or the witness of generations of faithful venerating the place, or simply placing the sights, the smells, the words and the sounds of a particular location in one's heart and memories to be accessed every time, for now on, when a scripture passage is read or a special feast is celebrated.

Our pilgrimage group of nearly 50 have overcome exhausting heat, miles of walking, injury, sickness, problems with the passport office, a not-insignificant investment of time and money, and hours of riding in planes and busses to get to these places, and God has drawn each of us here in his providence to speak to our hearts. Like the first disciples who encountered the empty tomb some thousand years ago, I pray that I and the rest of our travelers, having seen and reverenced that tomb for ourselves and in-person, may be even better witnesses to the faith we all share which is timeless. See you next weekend!







At the beginning of Lent in 2020 we started the Ascension Press' study program on Wisdom literature. We were able to hold just about 3 sessions and COVID shut

us down. We will be restarting the study of the Wisdom from the beginning on Wednesday, September 28th at 6:30 p.m. in the parish hall. This will run for 8 weeks. What is "Wisdom Literature"? Wisdom Literature comes from the Old Testament books of Job, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, Song of Songs, Wisdom, and Sirach.... some would also include the Psalms. These books are rather strange and different from many of the other scriptural books, as they are not really narrative in nature, but rather are filled with canticles and sayings and maxims which are passed along with the hope that the reader can become "wise" in the ways of God. The program we will be running was put together by Jeff Cavins and Thomas Smith and is called "Wisdom: God's Vision for Life". All are invited.
