October 23, 2022 Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



The Gospel today shows two completely different kinds of prayer. One, the Pharisee, a man of influence and pride, prays a prayer to his own ego: "O, God, I thank you that I am not like the rest of humanity— greedy, dishonest, adulterous—or even like this tax collector. I fast and I pay tithes." In contrast, the other man, the tax collector, comes before God and proclaims, "O God, be merciful to me, a sinner."

Prayer is one of the most challenging activities of the Christian spiritual life. There are few peo-

ple out there who believe that they are praying "enough". Many people wonder 'how do I pray" or 'what do I pray about?' These are all good questions, and there are many answers—too many to try to include in this small space.

But our Gospel this week shows us something important. Authentic prayer is never about the self; it can never be the opportunity for an ego-trip. We do not pray to complement or praise ourselves. We do not pray with the primary goal of satisfying our own needs and longings. Yes, there may be a need in our heart to pray, but this prayer flows from the heart, by the power of the Holy Spirit, in praise of God alone. Anything else is *idolatry*—praise or worship of anything which is *not* God.

The tax collector acknowledged that he stood before God empty-handed, needing only God's love and forgiveness. We too, regardless of our riches and righteousness in this world, will all appear before the glory of God in need of redemption. The Pharisee could not see this, and thus had no room to receive anything from his Creator. He was telling God who he was and even separating himself from the worshipping community by telling God he was something better.

Humility is the virtue that conquers pride. Pride is the primordial sin from which all other sins come. To enter into prayer and God's friendship, we must set aside worldly pride which tells us we are self-made people. Let us remember this as we pray and worship together.

We are getting into that time of year, so a friendly reminder: Please remember: when win-

ter weather is bad, the Sunday obligation can be considered *lifted* when one reasonably believes that travel presents a significant hazard to them. This decision should be made conscientiously, but without scruple. A good standard would be to ask yourself if you would leave the house for any other non-emergency reason during the day, such as to go to the grocery store or a restaurant, to meet family or friends, or to attend a sports practice or game. We will make every effort here at the church to keep our grounds cleared for Saturday



night and Sunday Mass, but cannot guarantee the safety of all of the grounds and sidewalks all of the time. Short of personal injury/illness to me or catastrophic physical plant problems, Sunday Mass will not cancelled for weather emergencies, but please use better-than-normal discretion during ice, snow, and dangerous cold!

Parishioners are also urged to use prudence and good judgment with respect to cold and flu season. Stay home if you are sick! COVID is still a presence and concern, and especially for the elderly and the immune-compromised, this needs to be a consideration for the sake of your health an safety.

Those who find themselves unable to go to Mass due to weather, health, or any other reason are encouraged to spend time in prayer at home. We are blessed to have a televised Mass here in Quincy, thanks to the Knights of Columbus, who sponsor and produce the broadcast each week on KHQA. This is a worthy and pious means to join the Church in prayer and to stir the desire for the intimate Spiritual Communion experienced at Mass. But remember that television 'attendance' does not substitute for actual Mass attendance to fulfil the Sunday obligation. Rather, when God does not provide the means to attend Mass as usual due to legitimate health or safety concerns, the obligation is simply considered 'lifted'.
