A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

Tuesday, November 1 is the Solemnity of All Saints, a Holy Day of Obligation. Masses at St. Anthony will be 4:00 pm on Monday, and 7:30 am, 9:00 am, and 6:30 pm on Tuesday. The students of St. Dominic School will be joining us for the 9 am Mass on Tuesday. The All Saints Solemnity commemorates all of those made in the image and likeness of God, both known and unknown, who have been granted the eternal glory of heaven.

The following day, while not a day of obligation, is set aside by the Church to pray for All Souls. This commemoration all of the faithful departed who have died in Christ, and are awaiting final



satisfaction for the cleansing of their sins. Mass will be at 8:30 am at St. Dominic School as usual on Wednesday and at 6pm at St. Anthony Church.

According to our own tradition in the parish, we will have a special remembrance of those from our parish who have died at the 6:30 pm Mass on Saturday night, November 5. Families have been invited to present photographs of their departed loved ones, which will be on display through the month of November in the church, inviting parishioners to pray for those who have died in the past year.

In his letter *Gaudete et Exsultate* "Rejoice and Be Glad", Pope Francis writes that we need not be 'superheroes' in order to be holy—such a standard might discourage us from even *trying* to be holy! Rather, our focus needs to be on simply and honestly "living our lives with love and... bearing witness in [to Christ] in everything that we do, wherever we find ourselves." (14) We do this by embracing the power of the Holy Spirit at work in our lives and reverencing that Spirit gifted in others. We offer our work, our sacrifices, our sufferings to the glory of Jesus Christ for others to see in today's world (23). As we read on the feast of All Saints (and often also on All Soul's) the Beatitudes give a form and appearance to what life in Christ is all about. We can be holy by being poor in spirit, meek and humble, keeping clean of heart, living in mercy, comforting the sorrow, working for justice, sowing peace, and following the Gospel even and especially when facing challenges.



Our Gospel for this weekend reminds us how urgently the Lord wishes to call each and every person to holiness. One day as Jesus was passing through Jericho, the place was buzzing with crowds and excitement. His disciples and other believers pressed in close, while others watched from afar. But as Jesus walked through the city, a man who knew the weight of his sin and his need of redemption wanted to steal just a glimpse of the famous prophet. Zacchaeus knew he was not worthy to come close, much less touch Jesus, because of his unclean ways-- he was a tax collector for the Romans and a traitor to

his own people. For him, it would be just good enough for him to stand at a distance and watch, as not to trouble the prophet or draw attention to himself. And so hearing the crowds approach, he climbed a tree knowing the moment was at hand. He would get to see the prophet! Little did he know this moment would change his life and that we would be remembering him these twenty centuries later. Jesus didn't just walk by. He stopped and called on Zacchaeus. "Come down quickly, for today I must stay at your house!"

Jesus aches with a thirst for each person entrusted him by his Father. No sinner would be beyond his reach, if they turn to him and be saved. We want to see. We want to be close. But Jesus wants us even more. He wants us to be holy. He wants us to be saints... restored to our full stature as children of God for all eternity. He wants this for us even more than we even want it for ourselves!

How do we respond to this invitation? We give thanks and worship in all that we say and all that we do. We take upon ourselves the name and title "Christian", for we know that the blood of Christ, poured out at so great a price upon the cross, is the wellspring of our hope. We live our lives as a gift and witness to others, starting with our own families and expanding out to all who will listen in a world veiled in darkness and sin and separation from God.


