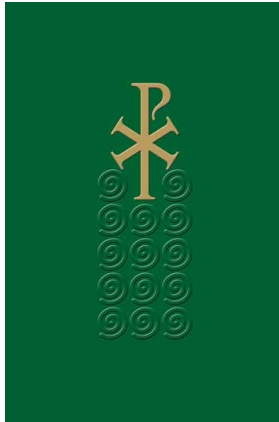

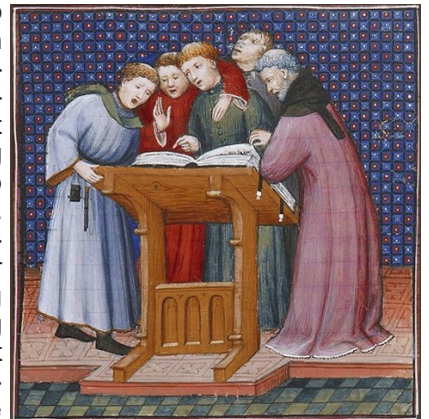


New Hymnals: For many years now we have been using the “Breaking Bread” hymnal published by Oregon Catholic Press (OCP). This is a yearly subscription providing a fairly comprehensive repertoire of sacred music for use at Mass along with the readings for each week. Because of a price increase (now a bit more than \$7 per book) next year and some other changes that were announced by OCP, a decision was made to replace that subscription with hard-backed hymnals which can remain in the pews over a number of years, rather than being replaced annually. While cost was not the main driver of this decision, by my estimation we should be money-ahead by using permanent hymnals after about three years. Because new the “Journeysongs” (3rd Edition) hymnal is also published by OCP, there will be little or no change in the essential repertoire or wording of hymns and music.

The only difference which will be readily apparent is that we will need to perhaps help guide our parishioners to the correct readings for Mass, which are found toward the back of the hymnal. For the time being, I am going to ask lectors to announce that number before the readings and also have the number posted on the song board for Sunday and Holy Day Masses. We are probably going to create an insert for the back pocket of the book (or maybe a book mark?) with a chart listing dates, the celebration for each date (i.e., this week is the 32nd Sunday of Ordinary Time in Year C), and the number of the reading (which for this week is #1023). Please bear with us as we get this implemented. For those who would rather have a publication in larger print or with dated readings, the Pray Together hymnals (which are produced in Quincy by Sunday Missal Service, our bulletin publishers) are also going to continue to be available. Please also be aware that the Order of the Mass is found in the pages with the grey edges, starting at #140. While our Catholic community knows the Mass by heart and probably has no need to refer to these pages, it is good to have a familiarity with the book so that we can be able to help out guests who need help following along with what is happening!

Because we need to preserve these new hymnals for use over a number of years, I ask that parishioners take reasonable care of them... please don't take a copy home if you want the readings— we do invite you to take a *Word Among Us* or even a *Pray Together* which are available at the doors. While it is certainly understandable and anticipated that accidents may happen, please do what you can to save them from tears, stains, and other abuse. We have purchased two hymnals for each rack in the pews throughout the church, so that they can be distributed amply through the church.

Most importantly, I want to invite our parishioners to be engaged in the celebration of the Mass through song and attentive hearing and study of the scriptures. Divine worship is the central ‘source and summit’ of all that we do as Catholics, and I think that sometimes we take for granted the value of making that extra effort to worship well. When we worship well, it helps us to be more receptive to God's grace. When we take shortcuts and reduce worship to something that is merely practical, efficient, entertaining, or useful, we start to lose the focus of making an offering of ourselves to God through worship. Indeed, singing and making responses at Mass is important in that offering, but we also express our devotion by our attention, our dress, our attitudes toward those who are present, and our willingness to enter into the rhythms of prayer offered by our sacred rites. While I don't want to overstate this, my hope is that the publications available to us will help us to worship better.



Wouldn't it be great to have a choir (again) at St. Anthony's some day? All it takes is a dream and some effort. These guys look like they are having a lot of fun. No doubt they are having a beer after practice, a noble tradition carried forward to our own day by many successful choral groups.

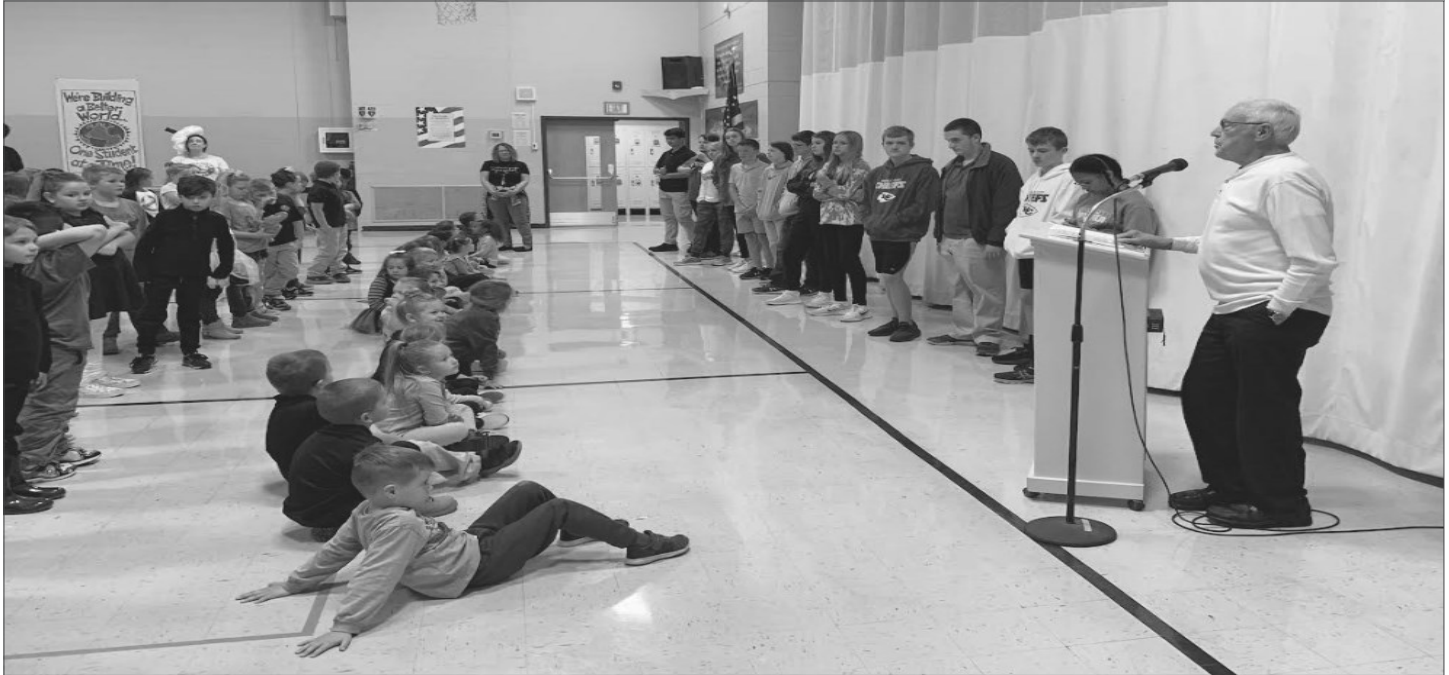

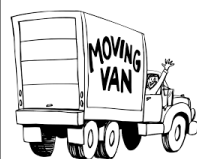
