“All that you see here— the days will come when there will not be left a stone upon another stone that will not be thrown down.” The monuments we build, the skills we obtain, the money we earn, the homes we build... all of it, someday, will come to dust. This is an irrefutable fact of our passing world.

Jesus irked his listeners by saying that even the most holy of places on this earth... the Jewish Temple... would face utter destruction. For the Jewish people this would imply the ‘end of the world’— certainly the end of their society as they know it.

So when will that time come? Jesus refuses to answer directly. Scholars and pastors and prophets and scam artists have been trying to discern this truth for ages. When will the world come to an end? Jesus counters by saying that there will be false prophets and wars and insurrections. There will be earthquakes, famines, plagues, persecutions, and other mighty signs. It’s as if Jesus says, “Don’t waste your time on them. Don’t let this distract you. Trust in me alone.” The virtue

Jesus offers is ‘perseverance’. Rest in him. Trust him. Do not get caught up in the drama of all you see around you. God is present even when everything else turns to dust. —

### We have a number of very important announcements which I am highlighting:

1. The **Quincy Catholic Education System** bylaws, enabling our Quincy parishes to work more cooperatively in the ministry of providing Catholic Schools and Catholic Education, are about ready to be implemented. The most important work taking place now is setting the corporate structure and laying out the vision for how we will work together in the coming years to keep Catholic Education strong in our community. The essential corporate structure flows from the bishop as the ‘corporate member’, and then a ‘corporate board’ consisting of the local pastors and the bishop (or his representative) providing oversight to the work of the schools. From there we are looking to appoint a “board of specified jurisdiction”. That’s fancy church-speak to say that the bishop and pastors are investing power into an executive board for our schools who will have the authority to manage the day-to-day operations of the schools in the name of the Church, and, along with the pastors, help develop the long-range plan for our school system. Each parish will be represented along with Quincy Notre Dame High School, and this group will meet to guide us in the next steps for our schools. We hope to draw from the talents of professionals, business people, parents, educators, and catechists in our community to make our Catholic Schools truly outstanding! If you would like to be considered to serve on this board, I need a letter of intent and a resume from interested parties. From these candidates, I am to make a recommendation to the bishop for the two appointments from St. Anthony Church and St. Dominic Schools. The appointment will nominally be three years (although that may be longer or shorter as we figure out how to cycle people on and off the board). The time commitment might possibly be considerable in these first years of putting the school system together, but it is a team effort and a magnificent opportunity to help form and mold the vision for Catholic Education in the 21st Century in Quincy. The deadline for letters and resumes is Monday, November 28 at the parish office.
2. We are in need of bids for **snow removal service** at St. Anthony Church this winter. Elmer Maas has graciously provided these services for years, and we give him profound thanks for all the hard work when the weather is at its worst! Interest parties should call the parish office at (217) 222-5996 to discuss our needs and prepare a bid.
3. On December 3 & 4 Ward Qumseih from **Holyland Arts** will be at St. Anthony Church with a selection of **Olive Wood carvings from the Holy Land**. Ward was responsible for arranging our tour to the Holy Land earlier this year, and his company represents dozens of Christian families in the Holy Land for whom the sale of this artwork provides desperately-needed income to Christian communities of Palestine in the midst of extreme persecution and poverty. These items would be most suitable for Christmas gift-giving, and along with the annual collection we take during Holy Week, the work of the Knights of the Holy Sepulcher, and other charitable outreaches, these works are vital to insuring that a living Christian community survives in the Holy Land.
4. Please put the weekend of December 16-17-18 on your calendar for the celebration of **“Forty Hours of Adoration”**, a weekend-long opportunity for Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament as part of the celebration of the “Eucharistic Revival Year”. During these most-busy times of the year, it is most critical that we take some time to quiet ourselves and reflect deeply on the mystery of God taking on flesh and dwelling among us. The Eucharistic Lord invites us to rest in him and know his love poured out in the Blessed Sacrament.
