## A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



Christ the Universal King: Our Gospel today portrays Christ the King as reigning from the 'throne' of the cross. A titulum written in Hebrew, Greek, and Latin mockingly proclaimed to the world that the man nailed to the cross was "lesus Nazorenus, Rex Iudaeorum"...

"Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews". One of the criminals tested him, demanding his assistance, "save yourself and us", while the other one rightly acknowledged that his hope was in the Kingdom which lie ahead. We join the saints and justified sinners from all ages who have stood before the cross and proclaimed with full confidence that that man of the cross, Jesus, is indeed our eternal and universal king!



Happy Thanksgiving! This week, I'll be spending some time with my family in Decatur. There is no school on Wednesday. November 23 so there will be no Wednesday morning Mass at St. Dominic. We Thanksgiving Schedule have completed our Wednesday evening bible study series, and so we will not have Mass on Wednesday night until we begin a new series after the first of the year. Fr. Blickhan will be here for Mass on Thanksgiving morning at 9:00am. There will be no Mass at

Good Samaritan Home on Thanksgiving Day. There will be no Mass on Friday, November 25. The parish office will be open for regular hours on Monday and Tuesday, but will close at noon on Wednesday and remain closed on Thanksgiving Day and Friday. All will return to normal on Monday morning, November 28.



Next weekend, we will have a special collection for our parish/school staff. Each year we give a small seasonal gratuity to each of our staff members-about 30 total-who work on our parish office staff, our teachers and others who work at St. Dominic School. Over the last few years, we have invited parishioners who would like to make a contribution to this fund to do so with a collection take up around Thanksgiving. A special envelope will be available in church, and we will accept contributions through Wednesday, November 30 at the parish office. As this fund is intended for the lay employees of the parish, Deacon Harry and I (as cler-

gy) do not receive any proceeds from this fund. Contributions received will be divided by a formula accounting for those who work part time and those who work full time. While your contributions are appreciated, please do not feel obligated—especially if your own situation this holiday season makes things tight for you. Further, if you wish to make a special gift or note of thanks directly to a classroom teacher or someone whose ministry has been particularly important to you, we certainly do not wish to undermine that, either. We have an exceptional team of parish and school staff bring life and vitality to St. Anthony Church and St. Dominic School each and every day of the year. Join me in applauding their outstanding efforts.



The Quincy Catholic Education System bylaws, enabling our Quincy parishes to work more cooperatively in the ministry of providing Catholic Schools and Catholic Education, are about ready to be implemented. The most important work taking place now is setting the corporate structure and laying out the vision for how we will work together in the coming years to keep Catholic Education strong in our community. We are looking to appoint a "board of specified jurisdiction"—that's church-speak to say that the bishop and pastors are investing power into an executive board for our schools who will

have the authority to manage the day-to-day operations of the schools in the name of the Church, and, along with the pastors, help develop the long-range plan for our school system. Each parish will be represented along with Quincy Notre Dame High School. This group will meet to guide and govern us in the next steps for our schools. We hope to draw from talents of professionals, business people, parents, educators, and catechists in our community to make our Catholic Schools truly outstanding! If you would like to be considered to serve on this board, I need a letter of intent and a resume from interested parties. From these candidates, I am to make a recommendation to the bishop for two appointments from St. Anthony Church and St. Dominic Schools. The appointment will nominally be three years (although that may be longer or shorter as we figure out how to cycle people on and off the board). The time commitment might possibly be considerable in these first years of putting the school system together, but it is a team effort and a magnificent opportunity to help form and mold the vision for Catholic Education in the 21st Century in Quincy. The deadline for letters and resumes is Monday, November 28 at the parish office.


