God called John the Baptist to proclaim a message of repentance in anticipation of the coming of the Kingdom: "prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths!" (Matthew 3:3) There should be nothing in or around us that would slow or prevent the coming of God in our midst. Those who are filled with the fruit of selfrighteousness are fit to be cut and thrown into the fire!

Advent is not a penitential season in the same way that Lent is, however the words of the Baptist underscore the importance of being fully prepared for the spiritual fruits of the Christmas season. Grace is just waiting to flow into our lives! What do we do, perhaps unwittingly, to block it? This is not a season to cower in fear or to languish in indifference. The coming of the Kingdom is meant for us... today. Thousands received a baptism of repentance in the

Jordan at the hands of John. We have received a baptism in the Spirit through Jesus. This baptism is renewed by his grace through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. This sacrament is available at regular times in the parish, as well as on Sunday, December 15 at 4pm at St. Francis Church where we will gather as a larger community to celebrate God's mercy through this sacrament. The words of redemption are not simply a historical event to commemorate, but a reality of the Incarnate God to be lived. Make sure to make a good confession part of your Christmas preparations this year!

Thursday, December 8 is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This is a holy day of obligation. Masses will be at 4:00 pm on Wednesday, December 7 at St. Anthony. Mass on Wednesday will be at 7:30am at St. Anthony, 8:30 am at St. Dominic's with the school community, and at 6:30pm at St. Anthony. The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception commemorates the special privilege afforded to Mary, that from the very moment of her conception, she was preserved from sin by the power of the Cross of her son. Not only do we recognize that she was a stainless vessel to carry the savior of the world, but as one without sin, without concupiscence, her "yes" in response to God's invitation was so perfect as to allow the Divine Word to become flesh to dwell with us all.





We are looking forward to next weekend's **Pancake and Sausage Breakfast**, here at the church hall on Sunday, December 11, from 7:00 am to noon. Adults: \$12, children \$6, children under 5 are free. As you know we also have a meat sale from the fresh meat butchered for this breakfast. 
