A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

On behalf of the entire St. Anthony parish and St. Dominic school staff, I wish a Blessed Christmas to parishioners, families, and visitors! We are pleased that you join us for worship today; may the sacred mysteries we celebrate this Christmas season renew in us the joy of God's redemptive love and inspire us to live more perfectly as witnesses to the Kingdom of God which is being revealed in our midst.

Pope St. Leo the Great (+461) writes of today's Solemnity: Let us then, dearly beloved, give thanks to God the Father, through His Son, in the Holy Spirit, who in his great mercy, has loved us, has had pity on us: and when we were dead in sins,



has quickened us together in Christ (Ephesians 2:4-5,) that we might be in Him a new creation and a new production. Let us put off then the old man with his deeds: and having obtained a share in the birth of Christ let us renounce the works of the flesh. Christian, acknowledge your dignity, and becoming a partner in the Divine nature, refuse to return to the old baseness by degenerate conduct. Remember the Head and the Body of which you are a member. Recollect that you were rescued from the power of darkness and brought out into God's light and kingdom. By the mystery of Baptism you were made the temple of the Holy Ghost: do not put the Spirit to flight from you by base acts, and subject yourself once more to the devil's slavery: because your price is the blood of Christ. He shall judge you in truth, who ransomed you in mercy, who with the Father and the Holy Spirit reigns for ever and ever. Amen.

Sunday, January 1 is the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God, the 'octave day' of Christmas and normally a Holy Day of Obligation. On this feast we celebrate the theological insight that Mary was not simply the mother of Jesus (as she is indeed that) but that she is also deserving of the title of "Mother of God" as defined at the Council of Ephesus in 431. While the title and feast focuses on the role and ministry of Mary, the title "Mother of God" speaks an important truth about our Savior, in that he was truly human and truly divine, as we proclaim in our creed each week.

As a Sunday, we will run our regular Sunday Schedule: **4:00 & 6:30pm** on Saturday, December 31 and **8:00 & 10:30 am** on Sunday, January 1.

The Bible and the Church Fathers

Starting in February



The scripture study class this winter will be on "The Bible and the Church Fathers". While many Christians know scripture, many are unclear as to how the Scripture was received in the early Church, bringing enlightenment to Sacred Tradition and the Sacraments we reverence today. Lessons include an introduction to the "Patristic Era" of the Church, the biblical of what it means to be a "church", and the role of the Sacraments, old and new covenants, and "mystagogy" in the life of the Church. Along the way we will meet the apostles, Clement, Polycarp, Justin Martyr, John Chrysostom, Augustine, and other heroes of the age. This 12-part video course is tentatively scheduled to begin on Wednesday, February 1 in the parish hall.
