

In April, the Quincy Catholic **Elementary** Schools Leadership Team hosted a series of listening sessions in each of the Quincy parishes, highlighting the work of this team, consisting of representatives from each parish school board and finance council, along with principals and pastors of each parish and lead-



ership from Quincy Notre Dame (QND) High School. In an effort to preserve and advance Catholic Education in the 21st century, the team is proposing a unified governance structure for the Quincy Catholic Schools. Implementation of this new structure is expected to promote efficient sharing and deployment of resources in all of our schools and provide a governance structure for further long-term planning and goals for Catholic Education in Quincy.

also has the effect of helping our students recognize their role as citizens contributing to the good of society and government. The bus trip was long and arduous. Students walk miles and miles over the week. It was a first time on a long trip away from home and family for many of them. Thus, it was a most memorable experience. Thank you to all of our parishioners who have organized fundraising activities to help our students and their families to afford the trip. A special thanks especially goes out to our eighth grade teacher, Hope Glidewell as well as Dave Cawthon from St. Peter's who lead the trip for our students.

Finally, during 2022 St. Anthony completed a project to rework the parking lot south of the church and in front of the parish hall. Funding for this project was generously provided by the estate of Kent Wellman, who specified in his will the desire that the parish undertake this project. We thank him and his family for this substantial gift, which was greatly needed. Kent, himself, was quite active in the Holy Name Men's Society, which oversaw elements of this project and its members provided a variety of gifts in time, talent, and treasure to see the project through to completion.

The Bible and the Church Fathers

Starting in February



The scripture study class this winter will be on "The Bible and the Church Fathers". While many Christians know scripture, many are unclear as to how the Scripture was received in the early Church, bringing enlightenment to Sacred Tradition and the Sacraments we reverence today. Lessons include an introduction to the "Patristic Era" of the Church, the biblical of what it means to be a "church", and the role of the Sacraments, old and new covenants, and "mystagogy" in the life of the Church. Along the way we will meet the apostles, Clement, Polycarp, Justin Martyr, John Chrysostom, Augustine, and other heroes of the age. This 12-part video course is tentatively scheduled to begin on Wednesday, February 1 in the parish hall.
