



Emma's Surgery & Healing

Our readings rewind us back to the beginning of Jesus' public ministry, where he is revealed by John as the "Lamb of God"—a figure whose life would be an offering to God for the redemption of his people, not unlike the lambs presented by the priests of the Temple. It would be some years later when Christ would mount the Cross on the day and at the hour that the Passover Lambs were sacrificed in preparation for the feast recalling the Lord God's deliverance of his people from the slavery of Egypt. For now, we are called to attention to look and see where the lamb leads and what he does. Our Gospels in this time immediately after Epiphany tend to focus on Jesus as a 'man of



action', healing the sick, comforting the poor, and speaking a Gospel of deliverance. We must encounter these teachings and let them sink deep within us that they may make an impact and provide inspiration, in preparation for the challenge of all challenges/, which must ultimately come, that we should 'take up our cross and follow [him]" (Matthew 16: 24).



Starting February 8, we ill be running a series called *The Bible and the Church Fathers*. As Christians, we have a fascinating history of reading and interpreting the bible which goes all the way back to the apostolic age. It is one thing to read the scriptures alone, bringing one's own meaning and interpretation of the sacred page, but how much more enlightening it can be to see the scripture through the eyes of those who personally knew the eyewitnesses to Jesus and whose cultural context was so much closer to that of the Lord himself. The insights of their prayerful encounter with the Word of God, ever-ancient and ever-new, can illumine our own journey in the Christian Life. We will meet on Wednesday nights starting at 6:30pm in

the parish hall, and each session should run between 60-90 minutes.



Vacation time! I'll be out of town until Friday, January 27th. Thanks to our outstanding parish and school staff, everything should continue functioning as usual. For emergencies at the hospital, please ask the chaplain to contact the priest-on-call in order to receive emergency priestly ministry, if it is necessary. Every pastor is expected to celebrate "Mass for the People" each Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation, as a way to keep his heart and prayers close to the people entrusted to his care. # THE BIBLE CHURCH FATHERS

The scripture study class this winter will be on "The Bible and the Church Fathers". While many Christians know scripture, many are unclear as to how the Scripture was received in the early Church, bringing enlightenment to Sacred Tradition and the Sacraments we reverence today. Lessons include an introduction to the "Patristic Era" of the Church, the biblical of what it means to be a "church", and the role of the Sacraments, old and new covenants, and "mystagogy" in the life of the Church. Along the way we will meet the apostles, Clement, Polycarp, Justin Martyr, John Chrysostom, Augustine, and other heroes of the age. This 12-part video course is scheduled to begin on Wednesday, February 8 in the parish hall.
