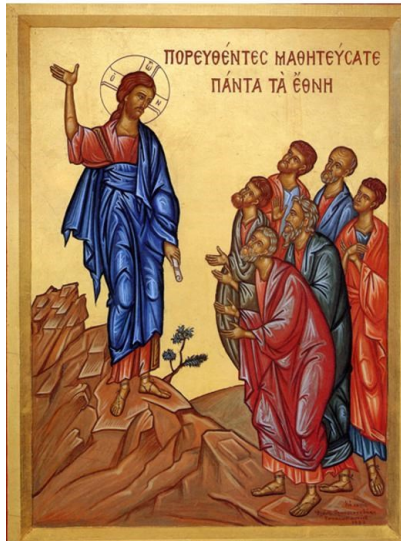

Matthew 28:19: Go and make disciples of all nations...

Throughout the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus often places before us questions such as, how often should one forgive? Rabbinical tradition based in Amos 1:3 suggests three times. Jesus' disciples generously suggest seven. Jesus calls for seventy-seven times seven times of forgiveness (Matthew 18: 21-22). The young man asks what he must do to gain eternal life (Matthew 19:16), after affirming that he follows the Law faithfully, Jesus tells him that he must sell all he has and follow him. These sayings are hard, but Jesus is serious about how urgent the call is: "If your right eye causes you to sin, pluck it out and cast it from you; for it is more profitable for you that one of your members should perish than for your whole body to be cast into hell!" (Matthew 5:29) If we have to ask ourselves whether Jesus is exaggerating in this last statement, maybe we don't understand the urgency of his message? He demands that we make the sacrifices and make the hard decisions in order to become holy.

The late Dominican moral theologian, Servais Pinckaers, OP, understood the Sermon on the Mount and the Beatitudes (Matthew 5: 1-12a) as the key thematic teaching of Jesus' ministry, in that Jesus was calling his disciples to a new standard of excellence, not merely a minimal keeping of the standards of the Law. We get a taste of the subversiveness of Jesus' teachings when we hear the Beatitudes, but according to Pinckaers, we also pray these subversive teachings every time we recite the Lord's Prayer and observe the virtues attached to the moral life. Look at the parallels:

Blessed are the poor in spirit, theirs is the Kingdom of God (Gift of the Holy Spirit: Fear of the Lord): corresponds to the promise of a Kingdom. We acknowledge that our Father and our homeland is in the holy precincts of heaven, and so as pilgrims we live modestly and humbly in this world awaiting that inheritance, "Our Father who art in Heaven, holy be thy name."

Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted (Knowledge): those who mourn have the consolation of the knowledge that true faith brings about a participation in the Kingdom of God, "Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in Heaven".

Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness (Fortitude): Seeking the object of our thirst and hunger, God himself, gives us fortitude in our earthly struggles. "Give us this day our daily bread."

Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy (Counsel): Counsel is the perfection of the cardinal virtue of prudence... in acting habitually in a spirit of discernment for the good and avoidance of evil. Those who have Counsel allow God to transform them, living intentionally for the Kingdom and leading others through mercy and example to follow them. "Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us."

Blessed are the pure of heart, for they shall see God (Understanding): Understanding delights the pure of heart with beatific (Godly) vision, helping them avoid duplicity and thus temptation by being simply having one's heart fixed on God. "And lead us not into temptation."

Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God (Wisdom): Wisdom brings not only external peace, but internal happiness and contentment, for peace is not the mere absence of conflict, but by the tranquility of order. "But deliver us from evil."

Blessed are those who are persecuted because of me... for every struggle in this world, the Lord provides his grace and guidance, reinforced in the prayerful tradition of the Church. ...**rejoice and be glad, for great is the reward of heaven!** "Amen!"

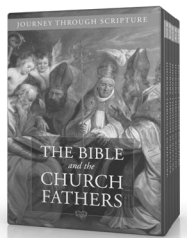

The scripture study class this winter will be on “The Bible and the Church Fathers”. While many Christians know scripture, many are unclear as to how the Scripture was received in the early Church, bringing enlightenment to Sacred Tradition and the Sacraments we reverence today. Lessons include an introduction to the “Patristic Era” of the Church, the biblical of what it means to be a “church”, and the role of the Sacraments, old and new covenants, and “mystagogy” in the life of the Church. Along the way we will meet the apostles, Clement, Polycarp, Justin Martyr, John Chrysostom, Augustine, and other heroes of the age. This 12-part video course is scheduled to begin on Wednesday, February 8 in the parish hall.
