A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



A word of thanks to Steve Jansen of Jansen Electric and Mike Whittland as well as the Men's Society for providing the work and materials to change out the lighting in the church in recent weeks. Right after I arrived, which has now been about seven years ago, we replaced most all the lights in the church with LED fixtures, which burn a fraction of the amount of electricity that the old bulbs did. While one of the advantages of using LED bulbs is that it is much lower maintenance (it is not necessary to get out scaffolding and make the effort to replace bulbs as often) the drawback is that when they start to fail, they flicker and draw distracting attention to themselves. We replaced all the chandelier lights in recent weeks and

updated the fluorescent lighting tubes in the ceiling with LED ballasts and bulbs. If you think it might have been just a little brighter in church recently, it was not your imagination! Please join me in offering thanks for in the generous assistance of the parish Men's Society and the many tradespeople who continually look after the maintenance of our church and school and its grounds.



<u>Lenten Regulations:</u> The Season of Lent begins this year on Ash Wednesday, February 22, 2023 and will end just prior to the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, April 6, 2020, when the Paschal Triduum begins. Lent is the principal penitential season in the Church year. All Christian Faithful are urged to de-Vednesday velop and maintain a program of self-denial, prayer, and the performance of deeds of charity and mercy (including giving of alms), in addition to the following minimal Lenten disciplines:

- ABSTINENCE Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
 - While abstinence is not required under the age of 14, it is laudable that parents teach children abstinence and other suitable acts penance as a way to learn and understand the true spirit of the Lenten season.
- FAST Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each person's needs, but together these two should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed.
 - Over age 59, it is laudable to follow the discipline of fasting on these days, but one should not scruple about modifying or breaking the fast at this age when matters of health and well-being come into question.
 - Under age 59, when pregnant or nursing, performing significant manual labor, or suffering from a serious illness (a chronic illness such as diabetes or hypoglycemia, or a more immediate illness where fasting would not be healthy,) it may be morally impossible to follow this precept, and so it would not be binding.
- To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful. "Seriously sinful" is a moral theologian's code word for "mortal sin," given a person acting with knowledge, freedom, and choice. 'Accidents' are not necessarily mortal sins, but may perhaps be a sign that one is not taking one's Lenten disciplines seriously enough, which may be a separate issue for one's conscience.

Masses on Ash Wednesday will be at 7:30 am at St. Anthony Church, 8:30 am at St. Dominic School, and at 6:30 pm at St. Anthony Church. The Bible and the Church Fathers bible study series will begin after Mass on (approximately 7:15-7:30) the evening of Ash Wednesday. We will again have Mass on Wednesday evenings during the Lent and Easter Season (March 1 through May 24) at 6:00pm.
