**Pentecost Sunday** marks not the “end”, but the “fulfillment” of the Easter season. We have reflected on our need for renewal and forgiveness, we have meditated on the love of God made manifest in the Cross of Christ. We are witnesses to the power of his Resurrection as a transformative force in our lives. We are promised the power of his Spirit to speak to others in the power of his name, being ministers of divine mercy and life to a world in need of renewal. It is this Spirit which sustains, protects, inspires, and empowers the Church on Earth until his kingdom is realized in its fullness. Thus we live in what can be reckoned as the “end-times”... the final epoch anticipating the coming of a new and eternal Jerusalem. On that day the Church, purified from sin and made holy by her Redeemer will be as radiant as a bride, coming to meet her bridegroom. This has been the ‘reason for the season’ which shall sustain us in the year of grace before us.

Memorial Day Mass will be held at Calvary Cemetery (1730 N. 18th Street) at 9am.  
 In the event of inclement weather, the Mass will be at St. Peter’s Church (2600 Maine).

During the Lent and Easter seasons, Mass has been celebrated at **6pm on Wednesday** nights, in order to provide an additional opportunity for parishioners to attend daily Mass during the week. It has been decided to continue the Wednesday 6pm Mass at St. Anthony’s through the summer season until the beginning of the new school year. Due to my retreat and some other events, the summer Masses on Wednesday evening will begin on **June 14. There will NOT be a 7:30 a.m. Mass on Wednesdays during this time.**

We are rapidly finishing up the 2022-2023 fiscal year. I need to call attention to the Weekly parish offering chart of page 4 each week. With cash depleted and five weekends to go in the year, we owe three payrolls (about \$33k apiece) and about \$16,500 in pensions, along with regular expenses such as utilities and so on. If we assume (hope?) that collections will bring in \$10k each week for the next five weeks, including this one, quick back-of the envelope math shows that this leaves us just about \$67k short for the year. Interestingly, I draw attention to the “year to date difference” in the chart, and it shows that we are \$68,725 short of our weekly budget.

I hate having to be a constant cheerleader in this area of our parish life, but it is important to address the needs we have as we fulfill our parish and school missions. We will have to do a little ‘robbing-Peter-to-pay-Paul’ to finish out the year, which means hitting (our meager) savings, perhaps shorting money earmarked for ‘next year’, and/or recognizing deficit spending as ‘debt’. None of those are good options. We have had a great year and completed many improvements in the church and school, and covered our ongoing operating expenses. I thank parishioners for their ongoing generosity and encourage all to look at their Stewardship giving so that we can keep our parish financially healthy!

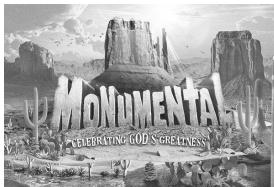
## HIGH SCHOOL AND COLLEGE GRADUATES OF ST. ANTHONY PARISH
