## June 4, 2023 The Most Holy Trinity

### A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



Mysteries are truths that are unknown, but not unknowable. When learning a new language, students decode letters and words to let the meaning of a text emerge. Similarly, scripture and sacred tradition teaches the faithful how to interpret clues that reveal the nature of God. The Church has distilled this understanding into statements proclaimed in our Creed and prayed in our liturgies. When we pray in

the name of the Holy Trinity, we use a privileged 'language' that invokes the very mystery of God, relational in Three Persons while unique and singular as One God.

Sacred Scripture never uses the explicit term "Trinity" to describe the relationship between Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Does this mean that the doctrinal construct of "Trinity" is a man-made teaching that is un-scriptural? Of course not. This kind of question, as any maneuver trying to reduce Christianity to a 'faith of the book', starts from an erroneous foundation which is held by many, even well-meaning Christians and Catholics. In short, Jesus established a Church, which took to itself the inspiration and authority to write the bible to preserve and conserve the authentic faith. By contrast, Jesus did not hand down the texts of Sacred Scripture in order to provide the vision and governance structure of his Church. The Church first comes into being in Christ, established as a community of faith in apostolic witness. From that faith and in that witness, we receive the sacraments and sacramentals to deepen and preserve that unity in Jesus. We recognize that the Church stands on twin pillars of Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition, which is a constant work of discernment in the Spirit.

And so, while the term "Trinity" is never used in the pages of Scripture, the very earliest Christians held and remembered what Jesus taught. They remember that he taught that he and the Father were one... in a oneness that is not simply casual or causal or even consequential... but radically and totally relational. The Father and the Son share of their common Divine Being, and yet are distinctive as 'persons'. Jesus assured the Church that he was sending the Holy Spirit to be the sign and the presence of God now and always until the end of the age. The Spirit is our comforter and guide and advocate. It is a wise analysis of Sacred Scripture that we come to understand the unity of Divinity within the Holy Trinity, worshiping as the One God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

As Christians, when we read scriptures or study theology, it is not simply a work of memorization of facts or figures, or simply recalling the details of the stories. In my experience, the best way I can describe the intellectual work of the Church is that it is about learning to 'think with the mind of Christ'. We read Scriptures week by week at Mass that we may come to know the mind of Christ, that his words may be spoken in and through us. We recognize Christ in our journeys as we carry the Cross. We recognize the power of the Spirit working among us. It would be a lot easier to follow a 'cookbook Christianity' where everything is laid out in prosaic detail, but that's not what we have. We have a faith that is steeped in mystery, precisely because the truths are too broad to simply be contained in a words or a simple formula. Does scripture use the word 'abortion' or 'nuclear war' to condemn these indignities against the human person? Has Jesus instructed us how to use the Internet or vote? Is there Divine Revelation to reveal God's will for our individual lives? No, but we can be clear that by 'putting on the mind of Christ', each individual person, in the diversity of their created beauty and need for God can approach Sacred Scripture and receive its fruits. They do so by learning to 'read' the mysteries of the world in the light of the Tradition of the Church.

God's will for our lives is not unknown or unknowable to us, but it does take an effort to dive into the spiritual life and to think—not as the world thinks, but as Christ thinks—that we can understand with his mind and heart. This is what Trinity Sunday is here to remind us—that God reveals himself in mystery, and the work of finding his truth asks us to engage our faculties of reason and discernment with even greater acuity than what we use to understand and thrive in our contemporary, highly 'scientific' world.

I am on Retreat this week in Peoria with the priests of the diocese. Note the weekday Mass schedule. Our regular schedule will resume next week.
