




The celebration of Corpus Christi was established in the mid-thirteenth century in response to diminished veneration of the Eucharist throughout the Church and the proliferation of Eucharistic heresies in the late Middle-Ages. The Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ is taken as an opportunity to re-visit the mysteries of Holy Thursday, doing so not in the shadow of the impending Cross, but in the glory of the Resurrection and Ascension of our Lord, and descent of the Holy Spirit. The Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ is held on the Sunday after Trinity Sunday, so that the faithful might more fully observe this celebration with Mass, and where possible, public demonstrations by processions and adoration.

There are two dimensions of this celebration which are highlighted in the prayers and readings for this feast. First and foremost is the worship of the Real Presence of our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. This personal presence of Christ is a central and necessary reality uniting

the Church in faith. It is the source of our spiritual life and growth, and the hope of our eternal salvation. To hold the Eucharist up in the fullness and integrity of the Catholic Faith (orthodoxy) and to celebrate in our Sacred Liturgy and live it in our lives rightly, "in spirit and in truth" (orthopraxy), we come to know, without exaggeration, minimization, superstition, heresy, or error, the gift and mystery of our Lord's presence. In this personal knowledge of God's love for us as his children and as members of his Church, we are thus properly-equipped to share his Good News with others.

From our celebration and observance flows the unique effect of Eucharistic worship which cannot be generated in any other way, namely the unity within the Church as the Mystical Body of Christ. This reality illuminates even more fully the mystery of God's presence we celebrate in this day. In our offering of the Eucharist, we join the selfoffering of God's only Son for the salvation of the world. Live it! Love it! Be it! The Real Eucharistic Presence of our Lord and the Church's identity as the Mystical Body of Christ are nothing less than the source and summit of our entire Catholic faith.
