In our first reading, Zechariah is writing in the era after the captivity in Babylon. The people were weary of war and the struggle to find their way back home. The children of Israel had never known what it was like to live in their homeland, and while they recognized that God had delivered them from exile, they had a challenging task before them to rebuild the Temple in Jerusalem figure out the patterns of worship and sacrifice which

had fallen silent for more than a generation.

But the people knew from scripture that when that project was completed and all was back to normal, their greatest dream would be fulfilled: the arrival of the Messiah, bringing all nations into peace through his dominion. Indeed, the Jewish people today also hold the same aspiration that one day they will be able, against all odds, to rebuild the Temple in Jerusalem and resume the ritual sacrifices in anticipation of the coming of Messiah. In our Christian era, we Christians identify this prophecy with the Second Coming of our Lord. Given the tensions of that region and the occupancy of the Temple Mount this day, we know that such an operation would inflame military rivalries in such a way as perhaps to anticipate a great age-ending conflagration of war.

But in reference to this week's readings, from Zechariah we turn to the Gospel where Jesus takes to himself the identity of the one who was prophesized to enter the temple to announce the Kingdom. But Jesus announces that he prizes meekness and humility, signaling not a war to end all wars, but a plan to usher in a new age. The wise and the learned will be set aside. The powerful upon war-horses and wielding weapons of battle will stand down. The Lord comes to offer enduring rest will learn to take up his gentle yoke, rather than grow strong through conquest, self-sufficiency, and control.

Our age honors those who struggle and fight to get ahead. We honor the strong who persevere in the light of life-threatening illness. We spend beyond our means to provide for college, a comfortable home, vehicles, and retirement investments. We speed down the roads to get to our destination before others, we speak up to gain attention in the midst of the crowds. Our Lord has another plan. Be at peace and rest in him. The world will take care of itself. This is not to say that we should not work and strive and use the graces that are sent to us, but I think the distinction is that ultimately, we need to be able to take greater comfort when asked to rest in the fact that "God is in control!"
