August 6, 2023 Transfiguration of the Lord (18th week of OT)

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



Once every several years, the **Feast of the Transfiguration** falls on a Sunday, and as such it preempts the normal flow of Ordinary Time. The gospel for today's feast is drawn from the 17th chapter of Matthew, as the Lord and his companions are travelling to Jerusalem, and the danger to the Lord's safety is becoming more and more apparent. In the verses just before today's reading, Jesus tells his disciples that they must "deny themselves, take up their cross, and follow

him" (Matt 16:24). Anyone who recognizes the danger facing the Lord in Jerusalem will also recognize that this call to self-denial is likely to envelop those who walk with him. The most common interpretation is that this event on the mountain top is meant to reassure the disciples that there is a greater purpose—a Godly purpose in their mission, as they continue their journey into the very heart of darkness which would be found in the religious and civil authority in Jerusalem.

This weekend as we celebrate the **Anointing of the Sick** at each of the weekend Masses, my attention is drawn to how the Transfiguration can be a reassuring event for those who face tremendous suffering. Perhaps that suffering can be joined with the consent of one's will, "Lord, into your hands I commend my spirit!" Perhaps that suffering will come unexpectedly, as if a "thief in the night". In any event, accepting these sufferings with courage and grace does not diminish our dignity and beauty as human beings, but perfects us in the image of the crucified and risen Christ.

I often speak about how those who receive the Anointing of the Sick are anointed unto the priesthood of the suffering Christ... a laying-on of hands and anointing on the forehead and on one's hands sets a person apart in their sufferings to offer this special gift in the midst of the Church for the salvation of souls. As we become able to see the suffering Christ in our brothers and sisters, it should inspire us to recognize the hope of the resurrection in their proclamation of faith.

Announcement: The Quincy Catholic Schools have announced the appointment of its first "Chief Administrative Officer". This is the first employee of the new organization, "Quincy Catholic Schools", which will guide our Quincy Catholic parishes in the work of creating a unified school system to sustain Catholic Education in our community for the 21st Century. There has been intense study and discussion taking place among pastors and parish representatives for more than five years, brining us to this point, that in order to preserve and sustain our schools, we need to be working together—not just aspirationally, but in a concrete and definite way. With the generous support of the Tracy Family Foundation and the guidance of the Diocese of Springfield, we introduce Dr. Christopher Gill as the inaugural "chief administrative officer". Please see the press release which has been printed and included with this bulletin.



One of the most challenging parts of the work that we have done is to make sure we are communicating effectively and broadly about the work of the QCS. I ask those who have questions about the work that has been ongoing over these years, to begin by reviewing the materials at http://www.quincycatholicschools.org. Under the heading "news" is a collection of the regular updates that have been offered since the 'listening sessions' of April of 2022 in each of the parishes. Under the heading "Listening Sessions Follow-up" is the 18 minute video and other material that was produced, representing the thoughts of the Leadership Team at that time. From what we heard at the listening sessions, we received support to continue to work on the joint governance model while at the same time being urged to continue to shape our vision and articulate our values in line with the needs and desires of the Catholic community. In recent months with the approval of Bishop Paprocki, the advisory "Leadership Committee" has been seated as a new "Board of Specified Jurisdiction" to oversee this process. Now with a new Administrative Officer, this group is being empowered to continue these discussions and act in the interest of our common goal, which is to have the best possible Catholic Education in our community. Our next step will be to populate work groups (listed in the press release) which will focus efforts on eight identified domains requiring the skills, wisdom, leadership, and insight of our Catholic community. The efforts of these work groups, working together with parish leadership and our new corporate structure, are designed to help us to do outstanding work in fulfilling the mission of Catholic Education in Quincy.


To All Catholic Women:
