A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



Dante offers consolation to souls condemned for envy, Hippolyte Flandrin (1809-1864)

Envy is one of those sins that we all know, but perhaps can't really explain well. Most will say that envy has to deal with wanting and desiring a good that belongs to another. "I want to drive a car like that." wish I had a job that paid that kind of salary." But envy is not limited to worldly goods—one can be envious of talents, of relationships, of wealth, of virtue... of any human quality of excellence. Ultimately envy is different than jealousy. Jealousy is the raw desire for the goods belonging to another. Envy takes it one step further. Envy takes sadness in the lack of that good and the holding of that good by another. This is truly demonic, as when one is envious, one chooses not to 'count their blessings' but to 'count someone else's blessings' and make a judgement against God's generosity and mercy.

In Dante's *Inferno*, those who were in hell due to the sin of envy were punished by having their eyes sewn shut with iron wire. It is through the eyes that we glance at the goods belonging to others. Cain looked upon Abel and his blessings with an 'evil eye'. St.

Gregory the Great says that from the "inward plague" of envy "comes hatred, gossip, detraction, gloating over our neighbor's hard luck and being sore at his success. "The contemporary term *schadenfreude* comes to us from German and was made famous in an interview of the author Joshua Halberstam on Oprah in the mid-90's following the release of his book, *Everyday Ethics*. "Schadenfreude" describes the secret joy one has in seeing someone else fail. Jesus was handed over for crucifixion out of envy from the chief priests and the elders were. Louis of Grenada writes that the crime of Satan is not impurity or theft, but the envious desire to snare humanity in an imitation of his own rebellion against the goodness of God. Envy corrodes the heart, weakens understanding, destroys peace in the soul and condemns us to melancholy and an intolerable existence. Fr. John Hardon, SJ remarked that envy is the only vice that does not bring pleasure to the sinner.

When we envy, we doubt how much we are loved by God and how generous his blessings are. Like so many other sins, the only thing that can heal envy is love. Only with love can our hearts be turned into greater trust in God's will for our lives.



A new grassroots effort is underway to limit abortion at the local level. The federal "Comstock Act" prohibits mailing and receiving abortion-inducing drugs and paraphernalia. A proposed ordinance would call for the lawful enforcement of the Comstock Act in Quincy, thus making our city a safer-haven for the unborn. Because of Quincy's location on the Missouri border, our community is vulnerable to possible efforts on part of the abortion industry to establish clinics or even deploy a mobile abortion van.
