A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



Render unto Caesar... Jesus evades the trap set for him by the Pharisees who are trying to get him 'on the record' saying that his followers do not owe anything to Caesar because of their devotion to the things of God. What a wonderful parable for our own time! How are Christians to be good citizens of this world when we are truly "citizens of heaven" instead (cf Philippians 3:20)? The answer is simple in words, but complex in practice. Give to each what each deserves: "Give to Caesar what is Caesar's, give to God what is God's." Even though governments are imperfect human institutions, they do bear at least a faint image of the order anticipated by the Kingdom of God. We give what is owed to our government out of

the requirements of *justice*. We pay taxes, obey laws, conscientiously participate in elections, perform public service, and serve on jury duty and in military service because it is right and fitting *for our salvation* and the *common goods*. Obviously, we also have an obligation to fight and change laws which are unjust, but that doesn't cancel our essential obligations as citizens. Christians are not separatists—just the opposite—Christians are to be leaven for the world, even assisting secular government in its goal of building a 'more perfect union'.



Pray for peace in Israel! The U.S. Bishops, in union with the Latin Patriarch, His Eminence Pierbattista Pizzaballa, request prayers, fasting, and devotions for the intentions of peace in the Holy Land. This troubled region need not be hopelessly lost in constant terror and conflict, but courageous leaders need emerge with the encouragement of men and women of good will throughout the world, that there will be not only safety and security for all who live in this region, but also justice for all who wish to live in peace. The Christian population, mostly found in Palestinian regions of the West Bank is quickly being depleted as families reasonably choose to relocate for better

social and economic opportunities away from their homeland.

No doubt Catholic Relief Services will have a collection in the near future to support the ongoing work taking place in the name of the Church in the Holy Land. In December there will be a vendor at St. Anthony's who will be offering olive wood carvings made by Christian artisans in the Holy Land, which is a practical way to support the native Christian population in Bethlehem and elsewhere.

I urge parishioners to become informed, as best they can, of the roots and causes of the conflict. There are many very good and relatively unbiased videos on Youtube and elsewhere which can help with understanding... for starters, I like the "CrashCourse in World History" review, which (although a few years old) is only about 12 minutes, but delivers a thorough, practical, and even-handed review of the history of the region.

There may seem to be very little that we can do from half-way across the world to help this situation. Indeed, the unending conflict has a tendency to dull our sense of urgency with the sense that peace is only temporary or fleeting from day to day, month to month, and year to year. But our invitation as Christians, whose faith is drawn from the events and revelations coming from this very place, is to reach out in prayer, urgently praying in the words of Jesus that the Kingdom of God be made manifest in the hearts and minds of all, leading to a peace that the world cannot give. I ask that our parishioners keep the intention for peace in the Holy Land in their minds and hearts in these days.




A Message from Mrs. Carol Frericks—Principal
