### November 12, 2023 Thirty-Second Week of Ordinary Time

### A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



St. Paul speaks to his audience in Thessalonica, trying to allay their concerns about those who have died. The proclamation of the Resurrection of Jesus and the affirmation of life after death made a few early Christians question if loved ones who have 'fallen asleep' might have 'missed out' on that Good News. Paul offers a rousing proclamation of faith which echoes in the Church to our own day: If we believe that Jesus died and rose, so too will God, through Jesus, bring with him those who have fallen asleep... we who are alive will surely not precede those who have fallen asleep. For the Lord himself, with a word of command, with the voice of an archangel and with the trumpet of God will come down from heaven and the dead in Christ shall rise first. Then we who are alive, who are left will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. Thus we shall always be in the Lord.

One of the most powerful parts of the Christian Funeral is the opportunity it provides for the faithful to console each other with these words, as Paul instructs his audience to do. I commend our parish on the way it celebrates funerals: the luncheons, the special care for vigil services when they are at church, the attention put into the maintenance and upkeep of the parish cemetery, the notes and outreach that the community gives to those who mourn, the ongoing work of our Grief-Share group, and all the unseen kindnesses which our parishioners share.

The process of grieving for lost loved ones in not only a spiritual and relational trauma, but it is one that echoes in our primal being, causing confusion, anger, concern, denial... all of the righteous feelings of loss. But it is when the larger community can surround and embrace those who are disoriented in the midst of loss that greater faith can be found. Faith does not take away the reality of the loss, nor does it merely cover up 'bad' feelings with more 'acceptable' feelings. Faith helps us to realize the greatest reality of our humanity and the greatest hope for our loved ones who have passed: that they live in God now and forever.



On the weekend of November 25-26 (Thanksgiving Weekend) we will have a special collection for our parish/school staff. Each year the parish gives a small seasonal gratuity to each of our staff membersabout 30 total—who work on our parish office staff, our teachers and others who work at St. Dominic School. Over the last few years, we have invited parishioners who would like to make a contribution to this fund to do so with a collection take up around Thanksgiving. A special envelope will be available in church, and we will accept contributions through Wednesday, December 6th at the parish office. As this fund is intended for the lay employees of the parish, (Deacon Harry and I. as clergy, do not receive any proceeds from this fund.) Contributions re-

ceived will be divided by a formula accounting for those who work part time and those who work full time. While your contributions are appreciated, please do not feel obligated—especially if vour own situation this holiday season makes things tight for you. Further, if you wish to make a special gift or note of thanks directly to a classroom teacher or someone whose ministry has been particularly important to you, we certainly do not wish to undermine that, either. We have an exceptional team of parish and school staff bring life and vitality to St. Anthony Church and St. Dominic School each and every day of the year. Join me in applauding their outstanding efforts.




