December 10, 2023 Second Sunday of Advent

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

"It's the most wonderful time of the year..." St. Anthony Pancake and Sausage Breakfast weekend! We invite you to join us on Sunday from 7:00 am to 12 noon for pancakes and the best whole-hog sausage around... \$12 for adults, \$6 for kids. Thank you to all who, once again, have made this event a smashing success!



Next weekend we will be celebrating Forty Hours of Eucharistic Adoration

in continued observance of the Eucharistic Renewal. Forty Hours is a traditional observance of continuous adoration of the Blessed Sacrament— an echo of what takes place in monasteries and perpetual adoration chapels around the world, where the Eucharist is worshipped day and night. For us, this is an opportunity as a parish family to come together in the late part of the Advent Season to re-focus on the glory of God's self-gift, his presence given in history and mystery, in anticipation of his coming in glory.

We will begin on Friday evening at 4pm with a Mass in honor of the Blessed Sacrament, finishing with solemn exposition of the Blessed Sacrament at the end of Mass. Adoration will continue through the night and into the next day until the Saturday Masses at 4:00 pm and 6:30 pm, and then through the second night until

the Sunday Masses at 8:00 am and 10:30 am. At noon on Sunday, there will be a solemn reposition of the Blessed Sacrament.

In order to make this celebration a success, I am asking as many parishioner families and households as possible to consider taking an hour. Our hope is to have people from two separate households present throughout the entire time of adoration, such that as one begins on the hour, and the other on the half hour for an hour-long stay. Having two separate families present insures that people are coming in and out through the hours and backing each other up in the event of emergencies. (The church may not be unattended when the Blessed Sacrament is exposed!) Signup sheets are in the church vestibule this weekend and will be in the parish office during the week (office hours: 8:00am to 1pm each day).



Next weekend, Sunday, December 17, the priests of the Quincy area will gather at St. Francis Solanus Church at 2:00 pm to offer the **Sacrament of Reconciliation**. Our school children will have an opportunity to celebrate the sacrament this week on Tuesday. Additional times will be published in next week's bulletin for the week of December 17 at St. Anthony's. While Advent is not of the same penitential nature as Lent, a good celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation is a worthy practice in anticipation of Christmas, and in the spirit being 'awake' and ready for the coming of the Lord. - - -


