A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

As we quickly approach **Christmas Day**, final preparations are being made to celebrate with family and friends. For your convenience, here are the Christmas and New Year holyday Mass times for ourselves and our neighboring parishes.

Because Christmas and New Year's falls on a Monday, please note that there are two separate obligations—one for Sunday, which can be fulfilled anytime on Saturday or on Sunday, and one for Christmas, which can be fulfilled anytime after 4pm on Sunday and then on Monday. Indeed, while it is ideal to attend Mass for



the Fourth Sunday of Advent on Saturday or early Sunday, one may legitimately fulfill their Sunday obligation by attending Mass on Christmas Eve at 4:00 pm or 6:30 pm, and then fulfill the Christmas Obligation by attending a second Mass on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day. The only catch is that you may not "double dip"— the obligation is fulfilled by two separate Mass attendances for Sunday and for Christmas. January 1, the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God, is not a Holy Day of Obligation this year.

Olive Wood Handcrafted Religious Items

This weekend the Holy Land Arts will be selling their olive wood handcrafted religious items after all Masses. With the hostilities worsening in the Holy Land and due to lack of Christian pilgrims, unemployment rate increased to almost 70%. Ward Qumsieh is one of the few Christians that took the responsibility of helping Christians of the Holy Land market their hand crafts in the United States. Many Christian Palestinians have responded by fleeing the Holy Land. And, it is conceivable that all Christians could leave. However, the absence of a living Christian community is very dangerous for the Holy sites such as the Nativity Church in Bethlehem. By buying these engraved pieces of art, you help strengthen the Christian presence in the city of Bethlehem, the birthplace of Jesus Christ, and the surrounding areas. Proceeds go to the Christian families (the artisans) who have been working hard since ages in this type of tourism related hand carvings. Purchasing one of these unique items will help prevent Christians from leaving the Holy Land and build new hope in keeping the Christian culture alive.
