A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



This week is Catholic Schools Week. As St. Dominic School is the single largest ministry of our parish, our attention is drawn to the holy work which is done there each and every day, to advance the preaching of the Gospel. Our students, their parents and families, our staff, and our parish make a cooperative effort, at great expense and sacrifice for all involved, to provide not simply a quality private education, but a Catholic Education which inculcates all the best the Church has to offer: its theological heritage, its understanding of the human person and society, its practice of prayer and liturgy, its commitment to research and

knowledge in service to the truth, its orientation towards stewardship of the graces and resources shared by all of God's family, and its unity as the Body of Christ, serving each of its members as needed to orient them towards the Kingdom of God on earth as it is in heaven. Let's rejoice in the gift of our Catholic School in a special way this week!

Scripture scholars call the first part of the Gospel of Mark the "Book of Signs". The first several chapters of Mark show Jesus to be a whirlwind of energy and power: healing, exorcising, forgiving, preaching, cleansing, restoring.

This week we hear in our first reading that Moses had received an oracle from God that there would be a prophet coming who will speak the word of the Lord. God's people would have to answer for their response (or lack of re-sponse) to this prophet who speaks with nothing less than the authority of God himself. As Christians we recognize that prophet in the Word of God made Flesh, Jesus Christ.

Through great signs and wonders Jesus makes the Love of God visible and tangible. These signs and wonders are known not only through the witness of scripture, but also by the witness of dayto-day events taking place in our midst. I am endlessly amazed at how God so generously blesses his people. Recognizing these gifts and graces is meant to feed our faith and call us, in faith, to greater trust in and love for God who is the giver of all good gifts. Taking this understanding, can we understand why Paul says what he says in his letter to the Corinthians? Having been touched by God's love and God's grace, he joyously takes on the sweet obligation of preaching the Gospel for all to hear. This example is a wit-ness to us. We who see the miracles God works in everyday life are now called to share that Good News graciously with all we meet.
