First Sunday of Lent - February 17-18, 2024

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



The First Letter of St. Peter remarks that the Flood in the days of Noah, "... prefigures baptism, which saves you now. It is not a removal of dirt from the body but an appeal to God for a clear conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ..." (1 Peter 3:21) Noah's covenant with God looms large from the First Reading, inviting us to meditate on its meaning this First Sunday of Lent. Lent is a time of purification and deliverance, not by merely external signs, but by taking the death and resurrection of the Lord deep into our consciences and allowing these Easter mysteries to overflow in our lives.

"This is the time of fulfillment. The Kingdom of God is at hand. Repent and believe in the gospel!" (Mark 1: 15) In this line the victory of God is announced: it is a time of fulfillment

and the Kingdom of God is at hand. What is the appropriate response? Repentance and Faith. The Hebrew word, 'shuv' (שׁוּב) means to 'turn and go another direction...' the Greek word *metanoiein* has the sense of 'changing one's mind or mindset'. We have been going to wrong direction and are 'missing the mark' in our lives. The first command is to turn away from that direction in order to go another direction. What is that new direction? It starts with faith. Do you believe that Jesus has a new and better way of life to offer you? The cost of this new direction the courage to break with one's old way life, and turning to live in a new direction.

Lent is not merely a time of self-improvement... fasting is not the same as dieting; prayer is not mere meditation to center ourselves in the midst of a noisy, busy world; almsgiving is not simply philanthropy or charity. Place Jesus at the center of these practices and watch how the resolutions and goals of the season change as we learn to live not for ourselves, but for the Lord. Blessed Lent to all!

REMINDER: Mass on the Wednesdays of Lent is at 6:00 pm at St. Anthony Church.

Lenten Regulations: The Season of Lent began this year on **Ash Wednesday, February 14, 2024** and will end just prior to the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, **March 29, 2024**, when the Paschal Triduum begins. Lent is the principal penitential season in the Church year. All Christian Faithful are urged to develop and maintain a program of self-denial, prayer, and the performance of deeds of charity and mercy (including giving of alms), *in addition to* the following *minimal* Lenten disciplines:

- **ABSTINENCE – Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.**
 - *While abstinence is not required under the age of 14, it is laudable that parents teach children abstinence and other suitable acts penance as a way to learn and understand the true spirit of the Lenten season.*
- **FAST – Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.** On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each person's needs, but together these two should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed.
 - *Over age 59, it is laudable to follow the discipline of fasting on these days, but one should not scruple about modifying or breaking the fast at this age when matters of health and well-being come into question.*
 - *Under age 59, when pregnant or nursing, performing significant manual labor, or suffering from a serious illness (a chronic illness such as diabetes or hypoglycemia, or a more immediate illness where fasting would not be healthy,) it may be morally impossible to follow this precept, and so it would not be binding.*
- **To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.** "Seriously sinful" is a moral theologian's code word for "mortal sin," given a person acting with knowledge, freedom, and choice. 'Accidents' are not necessarily mortal sins, but may perhaps be a sign that one is not taking one's Lenten disciplines seriously enough, which may be a separate issue for one's conscience.




