# Third Sunday of Lent - March 2-3, 2024

# A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



Jesus cleanses the temple! ... a wonderful image for the spirituality of Lent. The temple is ultimately reserved for worshipping the one, true God. Any other use defames and desecrates the holy place. Considering that we are "temples of the Holy Spirit" (1 Cor 6: 19), the Lord wishes to cleanse our souls of anything that detracts from right worship. No foreign gods are to receive praise or attention. No sin shall cling to the walls. We have been purchased by the Blood of Christ, and at a great price! Make room in every heart for the Lord to dwell!

How do we cleanse the temples of our souls? We sweep out the dust and dirt and salt that has crept in, and we organize the good things that are there. It is sort of like cleaning out the garage, which most homeowners do as part of their "spring cleaning" practices. The Ten Commandments which we read in our first reading today are a great start-

ing point for deciding what to include and what to exclude from our metaphorical spiritual 'garages'. How are we doing with the commandments that set out our obligations to God: faithfulness, worship, and honorable language. How are we doing with our obligations to our neighbors? Honoring our elders, protecting the life, dignity, and property of others, being honest by our word, and taking joy in the gifts of others? As we grow in the habit of examining our consciences, when we find something that doesn't belong, it is time to sweep it out or take



it to the trash! Jesus wishes that our internal, spiritual cleansing should be complete, that our worship may be pure and holy.

When we find that the 'temple' has been corrupted and dishonored, how do we return it to its previous glory? A whip of cords and harsh words of banishment and exorcism?

Setting things right is never a peaceful and easy task, often requiring a certain level of effort and even suffering. For some, it is easier to simply ignore or maybe even tolerate a growing malignancy for fear of the surgery to extract it. Jesus did not compromise with the foreign elements that had invaded the House of God. Indeed, the events of this gospel dispel the image of Jesus as one of complete pacifism and gentleness. There is a certain level of harshness that needs to be involved in the battle with sin... there will be blood spilt over making things right! The blood that heals and purifies is that of the Lamb of God, our Lord, and it is the necessary price for our salvation.

Does that mean that we are simply an audience in the great drama of salvation? No. Jesus as told us that we must be direct participants in this drama. We must carry a cross and follow him! That is where the spiriuality of Lent comes in. As we spend this season being attentive to the saving work of the Lord, we join our sufferings... the small things we do to set things right in our own temples... to the work of Christ on the cross. Every pang of hunger, the discipline of focusing our prayer, offering ourselves through almsgiving... all of these small practices help us to gain mastery over ourselves, to correct our faults, and come to greater faith in God's mercy. Jesus has done the 'heavy lifting'. Are we willing to hear his Word, make a good sacramental confession, and amend our lives?



This weekend is Quincy Notre Dame High School Commitment weekend. St. Anthony Church has nearly fifty students, most of whom are St Dominic Graduates, in the student body of QND. We are blessed by many of these students being among our families at Mass on Sunday, and we hope to see many more of them living out their faith as they continue through high school, college, and into young adulthood. 


