Since 2001, the Second Sunday, or 'octave' day, of Easter has been observed as "**Divine Mercy Sunday**". On this day, we reflect on the glory of God's mercy in the full light of the resurrection. God's mercy is not something we earn by way of our confessions or our Lenten disciplines or anything else taking place in us, but rather it comes when we are least deserving, least able to help ourselves, when we are otherwise lost to the darkness of our fallen nature. Divine Mercy is simply there for our asking, which demands a spiritual posture of extraordinary faith and trust in our Risen Lord again, Mercy is neither earned nor owed to us for our works, but rather comes to us in complete humility, sincere contrition, and complete trust in the Risen Christ. From our experience of God's Mercy, we are called to share mercy with others.

**Congratulations** to our St. Dominic School Third Grade and St. Anthony PSR students who received the sacraments of Confirmation and First Holy Communion this weekend (Saturday) at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Springfield. In addition to Saturday, we welcome our young people and their families to the

their "First Communion" on Saturday, we welcome our young people and their families to the parish celebration of their "Second Communion" at our 10:30am Mass this weekend.

For most of us who attended Catholic grade schools and religious education programs, the 'restored' ordering of the sacraments in recent years can still be a puzzle. Before the reforms of Pope Pius X in the early 20th century, Confirmation typically took place in about second or third grade, with First Holy Communion typically being celebrated in about 8th grade or a young person's teenage years. Through the early reception of Holy Communion, Pope Pius X wanted our young people to build on their inherent child-like innocence and closeness to God, maintaining purity of soul in the midst of the dangers and seductions of the age. As a concession to the practical wisdom of religious educators who understand that families often need encouragement to keep their children active in religious education programs in anticipation of sacramental celebrations, rather than having both Confirmation and First Communion around 2nd grade and Confirmation often into the teenage years, and keeping children in the classrooms through Confirmation.

In our own day, the need for life-long religious education remains the same, and should be a hallmark of the journey of faith in each Catholic family. Bishop Paprocki, using Pope Pius X's rationale, believes that the graces of Confirmation are so very important, even at the young age of 3rd grade. And he is right. On the practical level however, this new discipline clashes with the attitude that confirmation often represents a 'graduation' from the need for formal religious formation. Bishop Paprocki argues that religious education should not end with the reception of the sacraments, but it should be a *starting point* for life-long catechesis and divine worship. I fear we are failing on that front as recent years have shown an absolute decimation of participation in our religious education offerings after our young people receive the sacraments.

Like weekly Mass attendance, part of being a Catholic and part of the formation we wish to offer our children is the discipline and encouragement to grow in the faith as a life-long pursuit. A third-grade faith is good for a third grader, but if one stops their formation at that young age, their faith will not grow with them, and it will become a 'childish' thing that only makes sense to the third-grade mind. Ours is a faith with so much intellectual and spiritual depth, that it is an absolute disservice to deny our young people the opportunity to grow into the fullness of that tradition. This is not a problem particular to our own time and age... we have seen it before when Catholics 'finish' with faith formation at 8th grade or the end of high school, or even at the end of seminary... we priests also need to be constantly growing, exploring the faith as it reveals itself to us in every season of life.

I invite our First Communion and Confirmation families celebrating this weekend to resolve to help their children to continue to grow in the faith, first and foremost through faithful Sunday Mass attendance, by participation in age-appropriate religious formation through their school or the parish religious education program, and then by living and talking about the faith in the household. Our young people have received a precious gift this weekend in being privileged to celebrate these sacraments at such a young and impressionable age. Let's make the most of helping them to take their rightful places in the life of the Church!
