April 13, 2025 Palm Sunday

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



Today we celebrate Palm Sunday, when we commemorate Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. Over the next week as we celebrate Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil, we are called into the drama of the deepest mysteries of our faith. We re-live these mysteries in our own time as if we were there at the Last Supper, as if we were standing at the cross, and as if we were looking into the empty tomb. God wishes reveal his love to us as we attend to his Eucharist and his Cross. It is no lifeless body that we worship though, as the mystery of Easter Sunday points to the final victory won in those historical days in and near Jerusalem. Our own observance helps us come to terms with the drama of that sacrifice

which is no less real and no less effective for our salvation in our time. Every time we celebrate the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, we come face to face with the living God. I invite you to take the greatest advantage of the opportunities which are being offered for the celebration of the sacraments and for participation in the liturgies of these days. May God continue to bless you and may this be a most Holy Week!

Holy Week services and activities will be held at the following times:

Palm Sunday — Masses are at the regular times. Confessions will be heard at St. Anthony Church, 3 pm until all are heard.

Chrism Mass — Tuesday, April 15 at 6:30 pm at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Springfield. This is the annual Mass celebrated by Bishop Paprocki to bless and consecrate the new oils to be used in sacramental celebrations. At this Mass, all the priests of the diocese gather to re-affirm their ordination promises before the bishop and before the gathered diocesan Church. All are encouraged to attend.

Wednesday — after the evening Mass, confessions will be available until all are heard.

Holy Thursday — No Mass can be celebrated in the morning, therefore there will be no 7:30 am Mass at St. Anthony or 10:00 am Mass at Good Samaritan Home. The Three Days ("Triduum") of the Lord's Passion, Death, and Resurrection begin with the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper. Mass will be celebrated at 6:30 pm, with adoration of the Blessed Sacrament taking place afterwards.

Good Friday — Mass is not be celebrated on this day. Confessions will be heard starting at 3:00 pm until all are complete. Deacon Harry will offer Stations of the Cross at 1:00 pm. The liturgy of the Passion and Death of the Lord, with the proclamation of St. John's Passion, General Intercessions, the Veneration of the Cross, and Holy Communion will be observed at 6:30 pm.

Holy Saturday — A final opportunity for confessions will be available starting at 3:00 pm in the church until all are heard. *There is no 4:00 pm or 6:30 pm Saturday night Mass on Holy Saturday at St. Anthony, or anywhere else,* as the evening liturgy may not begin until after the sun has left the sky and night has begun.

The Great Easter Vigil — At 8:00 pm, the Church gathers around a bonfire to light the Easter Candle and proclaim anew the Resurrection of our Lord. After the proclamation of the Word and renewal of baptismal promises, the Church gathers for the first Eucharist of the Resurrection. For those who have not been to this celebration in some time, especially if they have little children, be advised that this celebration will last probably about two hours.

Easter Sunday — The Church throughout the whole world gathers to celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord. Mass times at St. Anthony's are the usual Sunday times: 8:00 am and 10:30 am. The Triduum ends on the evening of Easter Sunday.

After Easter Sunday, the celebration of the Resurrection continues 50 full days, with the first eight days of Easter being a privileged 'octave', ending in the celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday the weekend after Easter. Each Sunday invites us to repeat the celebration of Easter Sunday with through and including the great Feast of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. As important as Lent has been to the spiritual nourishment of the faithful, the Easter Season presents its own opportunities to encounter the grace and mercy of our Lord.




