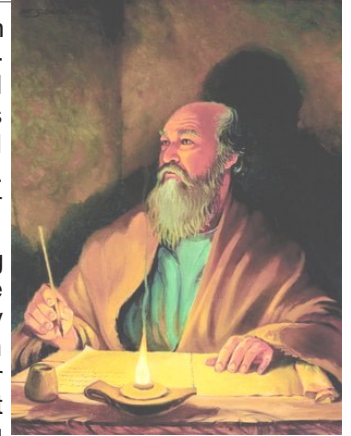
July 6, 2025 - Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time-C

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

Paul wrote the Church in the Roman province of Galatia in about 50-60 AD, concerning himself mainly with downplaying the differences and disagreements between Jewish and Greek Christians. The reading we hear at today Mass is the conclusion of the letter, where he says that he should “never boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ”. Being Jew or Gentile makes no difference to him, but rather that one is truly a “new creation” in Christ. (Gal 6:17-18)

There is a fitting parallel with the last paragraph of the long form of today's Gospel. In the Gospel, Jesus sent out the seventy-two to preach the coming of the Lord. When they returned, they spoke highly of the power that flowed from their hands... and Jesus confirmed that they had the power to charm snakes, battle spirits, and endure scorpions... but that they were not to rejoice because of these spirits being subject to them, but that they were to rejoice because their names were written in heaven! (Luke 10:19-20)

Both readings are trying to reveal the deepest truth of our Christian lives and ministries and apostolates. We will witness great things and make tremendous sacrifices. We will affiliate and identify ourselves with certain practices of religion. The key difference in being Christian however, is that we bear the likeness of the death and resurrection in our bodies. That in doing so, our names are written in heaven itself! This is not to say that the external observances of our faith are unimportant, but rather that they must lead to a true conversion of heart and a growing trust of God's power working through us. “Success” while on mission is not the primary measure of God's power, but “faithfulness” and “trust” in his will. Some disciples seemed “unsuccessful” and shook the dust from their feet as they left their towns. Paul himself recognized the defeat in the cross through the many stumbles and humiliations along his path. But in all of these trials, the promise of a place in God's Kingdom motivates each to continue on his or her path, offering whatever fruits result to the glory of God's providence.

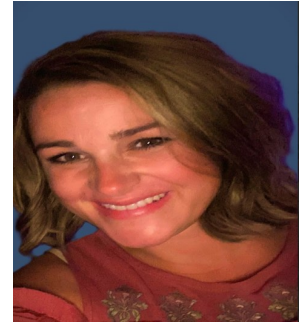

Help is needed on Thursday, July 17th, 8 a.m. to put Roast Beef on to cook and again at 4 p.m. that day to cut it up.

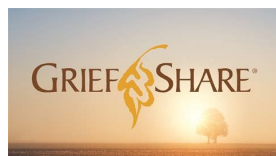
We will need help on Wednesday, July 16th at 5 p.m. to set up stands and then again on Sunday, July 20th at 8 a.m. to take them down.

Mass Intentions for 2026: On Tuesday, July 1 we 'opened our books' for **Mass intentions in 2026**. These 'intentions' are for the deceased who are often mentioned during at Mass, "for whom this Mass is offered". It is customary make an offering of \$10 for a Mass intention. While we do our best to accommodate date requests for specific intentions, we cannot guarantee or reserve particular dates. If there is a request for specific dates, we take them on a 'first-come first-served' basis. Finally, we do ask that for major Holy Days (Christmas, Easter) that a particular intention or family only appear once every third year, in order to make these dates accessible to others who might want to choose that date. When we schedule an intention, it is with the understanding that our schedule can and does change on occasion, and when a date cannot be honored (because Mass is not being celebrated or it is being re-scheduled), we will do our best to accommodate other dates and choices... please be patient and cooperative with our parish staff when that need arises. 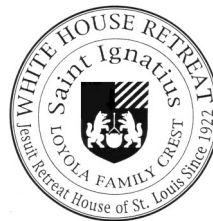
