Martha & Mary: Last week we heard the Gospel of the "Good Samaritan", in which we heard that mercy and Christian charity looks like *something...* it is an active involvement with the needs and concerns of others over one's self. Immediately after that parable, the Gospel presents the event of Jesus coming to the house of Martha and Mary and Lazarus, where Martha gets called out for being 'concerned about many things', not the least of which is the rightfully-important duty

Christianity is certainly a "doing" faith, but it is also a "being" faith, taking the time to rest in the words and the wisdom of the Lord. A "do-er" in the name of Christ who does not nurture the inner life can find themselves lost from the true center of our faith, which is Jesus Christ himself. And so, while Martha and Mary both have a privileged relationship with our Lord, we learn that indeed, Mary has chosen the better part

your nurse or chaplain know. We encourage all who anticipate needing the sacrament to ask for it in advance, in a timely way if at all possible, to minimize emergency calls.

Mass is offered each week by St. Anthony parish at Good Samaritan home at 10 am on Thursdays. We are always in need of volunteers who can come to Mass and help transport the residents to the chapel and back. 

Mass Intentions for 2026: On Tuesday, July 1 we 'opened our books' for Mass intentions in 2026. These 'intentions' are for the deceased who are often mentioned during at Mass, "for whom this Mass is offered". It is customary make an offering of \$10 for a Mass intention. While we do our best to accommodate date requests for specific intentions, we cannot guarantee or reserve particular dates. If there is a request for specific dates, we take them on a 'first-come first-served' basis. Finally, we do ask that for major Holy Days (Christmas, Easter) that a particular intention or family only appear once every third year, in order to make these dates accessible to others who might want to choose that date. When we schedule an intention, it is with the understanding that our schedule can and does change on occasion, and when a date cannot be honored (because Mass is not being celebrated or it is being rescheduled), we will do our best to accommodate other dates and choices... please be patient and cooperative with our parish staff when that need arises. 
