

## A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



Welcome to all who join us this weekend to receive the **sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick**. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (1499) explains:

By the sacred anointing of the sick and the prayer of the priests the whole Church commends those who are ill to the suffering and glorified Lord, that he may raise them up and save them. And indeed she exhorts them to contribute to the good of the People of God by freely uniting themselves to the Passion and death of Christ.

The effects of the sacrament include (CCC 1532), 1) union with the passion of Christ for the good of the anointed and the entire Church, 2) gifts of strength, peace, and courage to endure suffering in a Christian manner, 3) the forgiveness of sins, if unable to celebrate the sacrament of Penance, 4) restoration of health, if conducive to the salvation of one's soul, and 5) preparation for passing over to eternal life.

As a reminder, the Anointing is available when one is seriously ill or in the hospital by calling the parish office (217) 222-5996 and even using the 'emergency line' on the answering system, if necessary outside of office hours. We ask that you call to give suitable lead-time to respond to requests, although every effort will be made to respond to emergency requests, day or night.

Next weekend, we will be welcoming Fr. Francis Dais, representing the Diocese of Batticaloa in Sri Lanka, for our annual Missionary Co-op appeal. He will be introducing us to the mission work done in the name of the Church, asking your spiritual and financial support. Father writes:

Sri Lanka, formerly known as Ceylon, is a small but beautiful island located in the Indian Ocean, often referred to as the "pearl of the Indian Ocean." It is a Buddhist-majority country with two official languages, three ethnic groups, and four major religions: Buddhism, Hinduism, Islam, and Christianity. Christianity

was introduced to Sri Lanka in 1505 by the Portuguese. Currently, Christians comprise a minority of 7% of the total population, numbering almost 22 million people in Sri Lanka.

The diocese has an area of 2,854 sq. meters and a population of 1,289,000. Batticaloa's diocese comprises Hindus, Buddhists, Muslims, and Christians. Christians are a minority in Sri Lanka as well as in the Eastern Province. The number of Catholics in the Batticaloa diocese is 46,138 (3.5%) of the total population of the two civil districts of Batticaloa, viz, Batticaloa and Ampara. The Catholics are spread across 30 parishes, which are served by nearly 39 diocesan priests and 16 religious priests. In addition, 93 religious sisters and brothers serve in parishes, schools, hospitals, colleges, and universities.

Sri Lanka has gone through 30 years of civil war and natural disasters like tsunami, cyclone, floods, droughts, etc. Batticaloa district in the Eastern Province has had substantial challenges since the end of the war in May 2009. Further, the Easter Sunday tragedy on the 21st of April 2019, caused a suicide attack that occurred on the churches and hotels in Sri Lanka, killing over 260 people and injuring 500 people.

The pandemic dealt a severe blow to Sri Lanka's economy, which heavily relies on tourism and trade. Following the severe economic downturn in 2022, that situation brought Sri Lanka's worst economic crisis in its history. The country still faces elevated poverty levels and income inequality. This situation affects our Diocese very severely. The Diocese is struggling with maintaining priests and supporting the poor folks. In our diocese, 80% of the parishes are situated in villages where people are impoverished. In this village environment, people live at the poverty level, relying on their daily labor. Therefore, we have an essential mission to support these poor folks living in parishes below the poverty level.


