#### A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



"Lord, will only a few people be saved?" (Lk 13:23) I image this question might have been asked by someone concerned about his or her own salvation and worried that the price might be too high.

On the other hand, I imagine that this question might have been asked by someone who felt really good about themselves and wanted to be affirmed that they were counted among "the few".

What does the questioner had in mind? Sometimes internet-theologians and others use this as a trick question to figure out the supposed-'orthodoxy' of their respondent. "Oh ... the world is so bad and

so few people come to church that only a very slight few might be saved!" This might be the desired response of those who think that God's love is limited to a very special few.

On the other hand others who believe that there is much license to be had in their Christian journey might say, "God is merciful and there are very few who will be so selfish as to lose God's love forever." In this camp, many use the "Hitler argument," pointing out that even he could have been saved if he had repentance in his heart at the time of his death. After all, Jesus did tell the criminal on the cross beside him, "today you will be with me in paradise." Heaven is all but quaranteed because God's love is so expansive.

Still others, on hearing the news of an execution or the demise of a notorious criminal are all to happy to proclaim, 'let him burn in hell!.' for they are only getting what they deserve!

The answers that people give to these questions betray quite a bit about the attitude of the one answering rather than shed much light on this mystery of God and his kingdom. I think the right attitude about this question is to take the approach of Hans Urs von Balthasar, who instead asked, "Dare We Hope that All Men are Saved?" Some people (who have probably not read him) have accused Balthasar of being a proponent of "universal salvation", that is, that God in his mercy would never want anyone to be lost and that the likelihood is that hell is all but empty (which seems contrary to Scripture). But this is not how I read him. Balthasar suggests that we should be full of hope for salvation, but we also need to be aware that there is a real and serious threat that one can be 'lost'. God will do in his time whatever it is that will fulfil his plan and his will, and so the best position, perhaps, is to simply pray that I 'may be in that number when the Saints come marching in!"

But, I think the insight of Balthasar and the challenge to us on listening to this Gospel is to ask, "which side do I take on this question when it comes to my own faith and my own salvation?" Do I have enough faith in the mercy of God first of all for myself, that if I place my trust in him, I might be saved? Or do I instead trust myself and my own strength and ability to resist sin, perhaps finding it a hard, if not impossible task, to avoid damnation? I think the Lord is trying to remind us on one hand how impossible it is to 'be perfect as he is perfect', but on the other hand, how much we wishes to aid those who come to him in humility and trust. Can I hope that God's love is such that even I have a chance to join him in paradise? How do I respond to that invitation? Do I engage in tiresome, worrisome work trying to 'earn' the kingdom, or do I completely trust in his mercy? Maybe some combination of work, responding to his grace that flows to us each and every day of our lives, and trust in knowing that he will provide what is needed?

After answering this question, I think it is also important to examine our own hearts in how deeply we are concerned about the salvation of others? Do I make a point to be concerned about family and others we meet, that they are leading a life pleasing to God and compatible with the Gospel? Do we pray for the conversion of sinners and deliverance of those on a pathway leading to hell? "Dare we hope that all might be saved?" Dare we hope that nobody is beyond salvation? Dare we hope that even our enemies, or offenders, our bullies, those who have harmed us... dare we hope, for their own good as well as ours, that God's mercy is great enough that they might not be lost to the fires of hell? Our answer to this question says a lot about what we believe about God, doesn't it?


