September 14 , 2025 - The Exaltation of the Holy Cross - C

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



Yet another Sunday Solemnity this week, as we pause of observe the Feast in honor of the Most Holy Cross of Jesus. This feast originates from the fourth century when the Roman Emperor Constantine, who had not already converted to Christianity, was fending off a rival for the imperial throne. Out of desperation or perhaps curiosity, he prayed to the Christian God, upon which he received a sign in the sky, in the shape of a cross with the words, "IN HOC SIGNO VINCES", or "in this sign you shall be victorious". Constantine won decisively in battle over Maxentius and in thanksgiving, he commanded that the sign of the cross be emblazoned on the standards and the shields of the Roman legions. Shortly afterwards, Christianity would be come accepted in Roman society, ending persecutions for a time and allowing the Christian faithful to have favor in civil society for a first time in history.

Shortly afterwards, Constantine's mother, the 80-year old Empress Helena journeyed to Jerusalem to explore and recover Christian artifacts for veneration. In year 135, Emperor Hadrian had Golgotha razed in order to suppress Christian pilgrimages, erecting a temple to Aphrodite, the goddess of love, beauty, pleasure, and fertility. Ironically, this temple successfully marked and protected the location of Golgotha and the nearby tomb for about two centuries. St. Helena ordered the site excavated, where three crosses were found buried along with the titlulus (the placard) written by Pilate in Latin, Greek, and Hebrew that [this was] "the King of the Jews". It is said that, in order to determine which was the true cross, miracles were reported by individuals touching the true cross—a man was raised from the dead and a woman cured of disease. Shortly thereafter, the pagan temple was destroyed and Constantine commissioned two churches, elements of which continue to stand today. Indeed, just in the last year, excavations under the edicule, the small building-within-the-building over the tomb of Jesus discovered a first century tomb consistent with the accounts of scripture. This had

been the first such excavation in more than 500 years, accounting to the ongoing tensions between Orthodox, Armenian, and Catholic custodians of the Church of the Holy Sepulcher.

Today's feast is inexorably associated with historical realities of the times and places of Jesus passion and death, along with the history of exploration, discovery, and faith from those who would come afterwards. For the universal Church, this feast exercises the Christian sensibility that, rather than an instrument and symbol of shame... an instrument of torture and execution for our Lord... it is the very sign of hope and life, rooted in Divine Mercy. Last week, our Gospel asked if we were willing to 'carry our cross' in order to be a true disciple of Christ (Lk 14: 25-33), this week we reflect on what our faithful embrace of the cross costs... and the victory it brings.



This week I'll be joining the priests of the diocese for our annual convocation. This year we will be at the new headquarters of the Augustine Institute in O'Fallon, MO. You may already be familiar with the Augustine institute as the sponsors of Formed, whose programming is featured each week on the last page inside the bulletin.

During the week, there will be no scheduled Masses or activities in St. Anthony Church, as we are going to use this as an opportunity to steam clean the carpet. Mass at St. Dominic will take place as usual on Wednesday, but not Friday. In the event of emergencies requiring the ministry of a Catholic

priest, please contact the parish office, preferably during business hours. Use the emergency line after hours, only if necessary. Alternatively, please use the chaplaincy at Blessing Hospital to assist in calling a priest to the hospital. I will be back next weekend.

Fourth Grade Leaders Teach About Joy and Justice



During the month of September, our fourth-grade leaders have been teaching about the Fruit of the Holy Spirit—Joy and the virtue of each week, including justice and honesty. Mrs. Katie O'Neal provides a lesson each day from one of the following resources, the Catechism of the Catholic Church, the Bible, or the lives of the Saints. In addition, we listen to Sister Mary Bethany, a Dominican Sister of Mary Mother of the Eucharist, who provides the Daily Virtue lesson on our new Catholic Hallow mobile app. St. Mary Bethany taught us the meaning of justice, which is to give to each, beginning with God, what is due to them. She told us the life story of Saint Katherine Drexel, who was a religious sister, and educator. In 1891, she founded the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament, a religious congregation serving the poor as a missionary for Native Americans, opening many missions and schools.
