A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



St. Anthony cemetery is operated as a ministry of the parish. Parishioners perform regular maintenance for the cemetery, including not only the mowing and groundskeeping, but also digging and closing graves, and maintaining the records in the parish office.

Recent obligations by state law and diocesan regulation have required us to digitize our records, which has been done. (This is not a public database... yet... but we have made the effort to keep up with this requirement.) We are also required to have an "income care" fund established based on the size and needs of our cemetery. These funds are about \$40k, which is about half of what we would need in today's-dollar's in order to provide income sufficient to allow for mowing and maintenance without being subsidized by the parish on an ongoing basis. This fund has been building in recent years thanks to a focus on gathering these savings up and investing them while relying on the devoted work of Mike Hummel and his family to keep the cemetery mowed at no further expense to the parish.

We do have rules and by-laws for our cemetery, along with policies from the Diocese of Spring-field which guide how we operate or cemetery. I see that these documents are not currently published, so I'll be freshening those up, getting approval of our pastoral and finance councils, and then get them on our website. We intend to be in conformance with the rules and regulations of the Roman Catholic Cemetery Association, which runs Calvary Cemetery, as well as St. Peter and St. Boniface cemetery here in town. Like Calvary, we require grave liners or vaults for burials. We allow two cremated remains on one grave. We do not allow animal remains in graves, and we have specifications for headstones. Local funeral directors and other suppliers are aware of our rules, they and are expected to be able to assist families to meet those specifications.

On November 1, 2025, we intend to raise the price of graves in St. Anthony Cemetery. A single plot for a parishioner is \$350 (up from \$300), and for a non-parishioner is \$900 (up from \$800). We sell graves in groups of up to six. If a family is able to designate particular names to each grave in a group, we will consider sales of larger groups of graves on a case-by-case basis. We are not at this time opening a 'new section' south of our current section, but expect to do so in the next couple of years as the current section fills up, behind the resurrected Jesus statue. There are plenty of graves available in the current south section, with only a few in the other (north and mid) sections, most of which are already purchased or occupied. We are considering opening a few rows heading west from the current boundary of the north (old) section. If you are interested in 'availability' of graves in St. Anthony Cemetery, please contact Karen in the parish office (she is in on W and Th, 8am—1pm, (217) 222-5996), one of the other secretaries, or Mike Hummel.

A common question I receive is, "do I need to be a member of the parish to be buried in St. Anthony Cemetery"? Normally, yes. Our cemetery is for the use of our parishioners, as holy ground where our entire community witnesses in faith and hope to the expectation of the Resurrection. We do not 'hold out" to the public for burial spaces at St. Anthony Cemetery, but we do permit non-parishioners and even non-Catholics to be buried in our cemetery under certain circumstances. Generally speaking, those who are not parishioners need to have a bona fide connection with a family member who is a parishioner buried in our cemetery. In short, giving permission for such a burial cannot be a source of scandal or become a platform for some other manifest rejection of what the Catholic Church believes or teaches.

As for cremation, this practice is 'tolerated' by the Church. By 'tolerated', it is meant that it is not the normative or preferred way of Catholic burial, but it is not forbidden or looked down upon. There is the expectation that, cremated human remains are treated with reverence, which would include a proper Christian burial. Families are cautioned against attempting any observance that 'scatters' human remains or attempts to reduce them to a mere keepsake, such as a piece of jewelry or a memento on the mantelpiece at home.

Finally, as a reminder, it is laudable to pray for the dead— not only for those who were close to us, but especially for those who have nobody to remember them anymore. When we pray the "Parish Intentions" in the weekly bulletin, this is a Mass intention that includes prayers for the final deliverance and salvation of all the deceased of our parish and in our cemetery.

Eternal rest grant to them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine on them! May they rest in peace!.
