### A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

All Souls Day: The Church commemorates all who have gone before us in faith on November 2, All Souls Day. It is a most holy deed to pray for the dead- to join the Church Militant in the worship of God along with our brothers and sisters in the Church Victorious (the saints) and the Church Suffering (those in need of purification in anticipation of the general judgment). The All Souls liturgy reflects on the mystery of death, and the power of the Resurrection to provide meaning and hope when the world comes to an end for each of us. Unlike contemporary culture, which seeks to cover up death—to sanitize it, to decorate it, to fear it, to deny it, even to commercialize it-the Church calmly accepts death and comes to terms with it as not only a biological, but most of all a spiritual necessity. We must let go of this world in its entirety in order to embrace the life of God in the Kingdom. The Church also



reaches out in compassion to those who remain following the death of a loved one. There is hope in the Resurrection of Christ!

Eternal rest grant to them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine on them!

- On Saturday, November 8, we will renew the tradition of remembering the deceased members of our parish from the last year at our 6:30 pm Saturday evening Mass. Pictures have been presented by the families, and there will be a brief remembrance during the intercessions at this Mass. We thank our We Care and Butterfly committees who offer this service of consolation each year. We invite our families who are suffering loss to consider joining us for our on-going GriefShare ministry throughout the year. For more information, please contact Deacon Harry Cramer.
- There will also be a Mass of Remembrance for the departed members of the Knights of Columbus on Monday, November 3 at 6:00 pm at Blessed Sacrament Church, followed by a light meal.
- Finally, we are hosting a prayer service on Sunday, November 16 at 1pm in the church, to commemorate children lost before or shortly after birth. More information about this event is on the "Coming Events" page in this bulletin.

Following up from last week, on the discussion of attending Mass when whether is bad... Parishioners are also urged to use prudence and good judgment with respect to cold and flu season. Stay home if you are sick! COVID is still a presence and concern. and especially for the elderly and the immune-compromised this needs to be a consideration for the sake of health and safety.



Those who find themselves unable to go to Mass due to weather, health, or any other reason are encouraged to spend time in prayer at home. We are blessed to have a televised Mass here in Quincy, thanks to the Knights of Columbus, who sponsor and produce the broadcast each week on KHQA at 10am. This is a worthy and pious means to join the Church in prayer and to stir the desire for the intimate Spiritual Communion experienced at Mass. But remember that television 'attendance' does not substitute for actual Mass attendance to fulfil the Sunday obligation. Rather, when God does not provide the means to attend Mass as usual due to legitimate health or safety concerns, the obligation is simply considered 'lifted'. Again, a good standard to use, without scruple, is to observe whether one is well enough to go out of the house for other activities on the day... basketball practice or shopping or to a restaurant. If too ill to do these things, a person is likely too ill to go to Mass. The opposite is true as well... if one is well enough to do these things, the obligation is probably binding that one should go to Mass.

At St. Dominic School, we recite this prayer on "Miracle Mondays" during Morning Assembly for special intentions, since many people ask our school family for prayers. Several prayer groups in our Quincy community have been praying this Father Augustus Tolton prayer for years, which is for his canonization as a saint and asks for the granting of a specific favor through his intercession. Venerable Father Augustus Tolton (1854-1897) was the first Black Catholic priest in the United States. He was born into slavery, he escaped with his family to Quincy, and later was ordained in Rome because he was not accepted in an American seminary due to his race. He faced prejudice throughout his ministry but is now revered for his faith and perseverance. He was declared "Venerable" by Pope Francis in 2019.


