November 23, 2025 -Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

The "Acts of Pilate", sometimes called the "Gospel of Nicodemus", is a 4th century non-canonical gospel that gives tradition the name "Dismas" (or "Dimas") for the good thief who was crucified alongside Jesus. (Trivia extra credit: the thief on his left that rebuked Jesus was named "Gestas". We also get the name "Longinus" as the soldier with the spear from this source as well.) The Acts of Pilate were written by the Christian community in response to another 4th century document of Roman origin which was circulating that called into question the historical events of the crucifixion and resurrection in an attempt to justify the persecution of Christians in Roman lands.

This apocryphal writing is not accepted by the Church as an authentic gospel. Some parts of the document follow the official accounts from the Gospels very closely. Other parts, however are complete fabrications which, I think, in the best light should be seen as "fan fiction" trying to fill in the gaps and extend this most important story of our salvation. The second part of the account features Christ's descent into hell and subsequent encounters with Adam and the prophets and patriarchs as he prepares to lead them out of hell and into heaven. As I read it, it feels sort of like reading Dante's Divine Comedy. While the details of Inferno, for instance, have no direct basis in revealed scripture, it does have a logic and pious perspective which may be useful for study and devotional reading.

What strikes me about the account of Dismas in this document is the story of him, who 'carried the countenance of a thief' already being in heaven when Christ arrived with Adam. Dismas's testimony to the events of the Crucifixion and the Lord's promise to admit him to Paradise inspired the patriarchs present to proclaim, "Blessed be thou, Almighty

God, the Father of everlasting goodness and the Father of mercies who has shown us such favor to those who were sinners against him, and has brought them to the glory of Paradise, and has place them amidst thy large and spiritual provisions, in a spiritual and holy life. Amen."

While Dismas may have continued to bear the scars of the cross and the scowl of a criminal, the words and testimony on his lips conveyed the most sublime mystery of God's love and mercy and providence. Even he, a petty criminal, was worthy of divine love, and the works of God's mercy poured out upon him would be the source of great rejoicing. Dare we hope that all can be saved by the great mercy and love of God? Is it too much to consider that the most pathetic, evil, perverse, degenerate, antisocial criminals, who seem, only by accident, to bear the image and likeness of God, may also have a place in the Kingdom?' Jesus warns it is a 'narrow gate' leading to eternal life (Mt 7:13). How could there be any room for those who have fallen away so notoriously? The only answer that makes any sense is that God's transformative love is that great.

As we approach the end of the year, here are a couple of reminders on opportunities and tax-advantaged methods for charitable giving to St. Anthony Church, St. Dominic School, the Quincy Catholic Schools Foundation, Quincy Notre Dame High School, and other charities



1. Donation of appreciated stock: Stock that has gone up in value can be donated at full face value for a charitable deduction, with the secondary advantage of not incurring capital gains tax when donated directly to a charity.
2. Qualified Charitable Distributions can be made to charities,

2. Qualified Charitable Distributions can be made to charities, providing another tax-advantaged contribution at the full market value of the transferred securities without the usual tax on the proceeds. These transfers need to be initiated with one's broker or custodian, such that the funds are transferred directly from them to the charity. Your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) can also be made to a charitable organization under this plan. Please consult with your broker or financial

planner for more details on eligibility and limitations on these programs. We greatly appreciate the gifts that come from planned giving in this manner!

We also ask you to consider a gift when you **review your estate plan and will**. While cash gifts are always needed and accepted, your estate could be a wonderful way to provide a trust or legacy fund for parish operations, scholarships, maintenance, seminarians, or other intentions. Thank you for your consideration!

For next year, 2026 (when taxes will be due in April 2027), the 'One Big Beautiful Bill Act' is reinstating a \$1,000 (single) / \$2000 (married filing jointly) 'above the line' deduction for charitable contributions which can be made by those who do not itemize. For those who do itemize their charitable deductions, next year there will be a new floor of 0.5% of one's adjusted gross income (AGI) which must be exceeded before contributions are deductible. Because there are other limits and details, we ask you to consult with your financial or tax advisor for the details in your individual case.






